<a href="#">Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now</a>	\$1,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages. More specifically, funds will be used to serve more older adults in Councilmanic District 1 and to implement daytime classes for adults with developmental disabilities
