Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$5,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages. More specifically, funds will be used to serve more older adults in Councilmanic District 2 and to implement daytime classes for adults with developmental disabilities.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc	\$5,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services. Legal matters handled include domestic violence, estate planning for seniors, expungement, family law and other civil legal matters.
Educacion Para Nuestro Futuro Founded by Escfuella Bolivia dba Edu-Futuro	\$1,000	Edu-Futuro will use grant funds to produce three episodes of its public television series, Linea Directa. The Spanish language programs will be broadcast throughout Prince George's County by the region's leading Spanish-language station, Telemundo-44.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$3,000	First Generation College Bound, Inc. will use grant fund for general operating expenses in FY23.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide freshly prepared home-delivered Medically Tailored Meals, Groceries and Medical Nutrition Therapy to neighbors living with serious illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, HIV/ AIDS etc. who cannot shop or cook for themselves.
Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$10,000	Ivy Community Charities funds will be used to provide scholarships to students who reside in or attend a school in District 2, with awards to high school students entering college in the Fall of 2023/Spring 2024. Continuing or returning college students may be awarded scholarships.
La Clinica del Pueblo, Inc.	\$3,000	La Clinica del Pueblo, Inc. will use grant funds to provide comprehensive primary care and mental health services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate for low-income and uninsured County residents.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$1,000	Liberty's Promise will use grant funds to support their after-school program of civic engagement, held in-person at Northwestern High School, twice annually, in 10-week sessions, running from March to May and again from October to December.
Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc.	\$5,000	Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc., will use grant funds to continue providing health care, behavioral health, and social services for uninsured participants at its Adelphi Health Center in Prince George's County.
NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$1,000	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to expand mental health peersSupport across Prince George's County, and help bring access to quality mental health care to Prince Georgians impacted by mental illness through support groups, education classes, community outreach, and advocacy.
Washington D.C. Meal on Wheels, Inc.	\$2,000	Washington D.C. Meal on Wheels, Inc. will use grant funds to reduce food insecurity by delivering healthy, delicious meals to homebound Prince George's Co. seniors and the disabled.
Word Arts Focus dba Joe's Movement Empo	\$3,000	Joe's Movement Emporium (Joe's) will use grant funds to support their production of Out of the Vineyard, a play commissioned by Joe's and written by Psalmayene 24 (Psalm), based on interviews with descendants of enslaved families in Prince George's County.
