Arc of Prince George's County Inc.	\$2,000	Arc of Prince George's County Inc. will use grant funds to support The Arc's programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and our Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$3,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages. More specifically, funds will be used to serve more older adults in Councilmanic District 3 and to implement daytime classes for adults with developmental disabilities.
BCAUSEICAN.INC	\$2,500	BCAUSEICAN, INC will use the grant funding to hire more instructors, train and support staff, develop additional leading-edge STEM courses that address new technologies, purchase equipment and software, implement systems for data collections and course evaluations.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$2,500	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, a summer internship, leadership development, and a Electrical Pre-Apprenticeship to enhance workforce development and improve quality of life.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc	\$3,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services. Legal matters handled include domestic violence, estate planning for seniors, expungement, family law and other civil legal matters.
Community Youth Advance, Incorporated	\$2,500	Community Youth Advance, Incorporated will use grant funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.

Community Ministry of PGC	\$1,000	Community Ministry of PGC will use grant funds to provide 250 -350 COVID-19 impacted applicants (mostly mothers and seniors) housing assistance consisting of consultations, referral services, and small grants to avoid eviction.
