<a href="#">ARC of Prince George's County Inc</a>	\$2,500	ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support The Arc's programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and our Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
<a href="#">Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now</a>	\$2,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages. More specifically, funds will be used to serve more older adults in Councilmanic District 4 and to implement daytime classes for adults with developmental disabilities.
<a href="#">Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc. will use grant funds to be utilized for food and pet supply expenses for families in need who take part in the Bowie CLAW Pet Food Pantry. Also to provide spay/neuter, vaccinations and necessary vet treatment for cats and kittens trapped through the TNR program.
<a href="#">Bowie Business Innovation Center, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Bowie Business Innovation Center, Inc. will use grant funds to cover the costs of salary and health insurance for the Bowie BIC Operations, Director and to cover a portion of the salary for the Bowie BIC Executive Director.
<a href="#">City of Greenbelt - ACE</a>	\$2,000	City of Greenbelt - ACE will use the grant funds to award high school senior for college related expenses. Their Advisory Committee on Education (ACE) oversees a college scholarship fund for high achieving high school students.

<a href="#">Food &amp; Friends, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide freshly prepared home-delivered Medically Tailored Meals, Groceries and Medical Nutrition Therapy to neighbors living with serious illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, HIV/ AIDS etc. who cannot shop or cook for themselves.
<a href="#">Human Services Coalition of Prince George's County</a>	\$5,000	Human Services Coalition of Prince George's County will use grant funds to go towards office operations and infrastructure support, allowing them to continue building work as a capacity-building coalition for the county.
