ARC of Prince George's County Inc	\$1,000	ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support The Arc's programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and our Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
Charles Herbert Flowers High School - Football Program	\$2,000	Charles Herbert Flowers High School will use grant funds for the football program uniforms, traveling to LC. Norcom High School for their first game, and additional football equipment.
Christmas In April, Prince George's County, Inc.	\$1,000	Christmas In April, Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to continue their mission of free home repairs for elderly/disabled County homeowners who qualify and are selected for their program. They would be able to buy materials for their 2024 event.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$2,500	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, a summer internship, leadership development, and a Electrical Pre-Apprenticeship to enhance workforce development and improve quality of life.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$3,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs in providing scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the county. Funds will also be used to provide COVID-19 financial assistance.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc	\$2,500	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services. Legal matters handled include domestic violence, estate planning for seniors, expungement, family law and other civil legal matters.
Community Ministry of PGC	\$1,000	Community Ministry of PGC will use grant funds to provide 250 -350 COVID-19 impacted applicants (mostly mothers and seniors) housing assistance consisting of consultations, referral services, and small grants to avoid eviction.
ecoLatinos	\$1,000	ecoLatinos will use grant funds to survey Latino and other minority constituents from each council district on their perceived needs around climate change, environment, health, etc.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$2,500	End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc. will use grant funds for their Pathways to Career Success Program that develops students to graduate on time college, career and workforce ready. Furthermore, funds will support their Annual Graduation Scholarship Banquet for and organizational capacity building.

Continuing or returning college students may be awarded scholarships.

More specifically, funds will be used to pay for rental space, curriculum updates and supplies.
