Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$5,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages. More specifically, funds will be used to serve more older adults in the community and to implement daytime classes for adults with developmental disabilities
Bursting With Promise, Inc.	\$5,000	Scholarships for qualified and deserving Maryland students entering Morgan State University; laptops for high school students; backpack/school supplies for elementary school students; book stipends and graduation awards for previous scholarship recipients.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$10,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, a summer internship, leadership development, and a Electrical Pre-Apprenticeship to enhance workforce development and improve quality of life.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs in providing scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the county. Funds will also be used to provide COVID-19 financial assistance.
Educacion Para Nuestro Futuro Founded by Escuela Bolivia dba Edu-Futuro	\$5,000	Edu-Futuro will use grant funds to produce three episodes of its public television series, Linea Directa. The Spanish language programs will be broadcast throughout Prince George's County by the region's leading Spanish-language station, Telemundo-44.
ecoLatinos	\$2,500	ecoLatinos will use grant funds to survey Latino and other minority constituents from each council district on their perceived needs around climate change, environment, health, etc.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc. will use grant funds for their Pathways to Career Success Program that develops students to graduate on time college, career and workforce ready. Furthermore, funds will support their Annual Graduation Scholarship Banquet for and organizational capacity building.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide freshly prepared home-delivered Medically Tailored Meals, Groceries and Medical Nutrition Therapy to neighbors living with serious illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, HIV/ AIDS etc. who cannot shop or cook for themselves.

More specifically, funds will be used to pay for rental space, curriculum updates and supplies.

Funds will support expanded services across financial literacy and career readiness programs.
