Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$11,500	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, a summer internship, leadership development, and a Electrical Pre-Apprenticeship to enhance workforce development and improve quality of life.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$1,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs in providing scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the county. Funds will also be used to provide COVID-19 financial assistance.
Evolve Inc.	\$12,000	Evolve Inc. serves to create empowerment and growth in youth, particularly in underprivileged communities. EVOLVE charity efforts are guided by its core values and principles of Accountability, Character, and Service to Community.
Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$3,000	Ivy Community Charities funds will be used to provide scholarships to students who reside in or attend a school in District 9, with awards to high school students entering college in the Fall of 2023/Spring 2024. Continuing or returning college students may be awarded scholarships.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc., dba Jacob's Ladder Youth Foundation	\$1,000	Jacob's Ladder, Inc., dba Jacob's Ladder Youth Foundation, will use grant funds to support its ongoing programs: Academic Enrichment, Juvenile Reentry, Diversion, Trade Career Academy and Junior Workforce Academy. More specifically, funds will be used to pay for rental space, curriculum updates and supplies.
