# SAFE PASSAGE CONCERNS



- PGCPS is committed to ensuring each walking student has the best possible route as they walk to and from school.
- To ensure any concerns are addressed, we will utilize the Transportation Resolution System to process service requests.
- Once the service request is received, it will go to the appropriate department for review and follow up.
- The person making the request will be notified of the actions taken and provided with a response.

# SAFE PASSAGE CONCERNS

## New Construction



- The Safe Walk to School Act, requires a pedestrian safety plan when seeking state funds for the construction or renovation of a school that would increase capacity by more than 100 students.
- The plan must be developed in collaboration with the Department of Public Works and Transportation and/or the State Highway Administration and must identify safe routes for students to walk or bike to school.



# **SAFE PASSAGE CONCERNS**

## **Bus Stops Changes**

- Requests to reconsider any bus stop changes will be addressed by the PGCPS Transportation department.
- Supervisors will visit the location to determine if there are any circumstances that may require a modification to the bus stop change.

# **SAFE PASSAGE CONCERNS**

## **Traffic Calming devices**



- Any requests for traffic signals, speed humps or traffic calming measures will be referred to the Prince George's County Department of Public Works and Transportation or the Maryland State Highway Administration to conduct a traffic survey.
- The departments will then determine if a traffic survey or other actions are required and take appropriate measures.

# **SAFE PASSAGE CONCERNS**

## **Crossing Guard**



- The crossing guard unit is managed by the Prince George's County Police Department and related concerns will be forwarded to Crossing Guard Unit for appropriate follow up.

# SAFE PASSAGE CONCERNS



- Safety concerns: (non-police related)
- Safe Passage Coordinators in the Safety Office will review any safety concerns and make the appropriate referrals.
- In some instances, a review by a traffic safety engineer may be requested.
- Police related concerns will be forwarded to the appropriate police agency
