<a href="#">Arc Prince George's County</a>	\$5,000	Arc Prince George's County will use grant funds to support The Arc's programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and our Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
<a href="#">Bishop McNamara High School</a>	\$5,000	Bishop McNamara High School will use grant funds for their Family Support Fund, helping PGC students with fees, tuition, and food assistance so they can continue their education uninterrupted.
<a href="#">Charles Herbert Flowers High School - PGCPSS</a>	\$25,000	Charles Herbert Flowers High School - Football Program will use the grant funds to renovate the weight room to make it safer for student athletes.
