Bishop McNamara High School	\$5,000	Bishop McNamara High School will use grant funds for their Family Support Fund, helping PGC students with fees, tuition, and food assistance so they can continue their education uninterrupted.
Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc.	\$500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc. will use grant funds to buy pet food and supplies for the Pet Food Pantry.
Bursting With Promise, Inc.	\$5,000	Bursting With Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships for qualified and deserving Maryland students entering Morgan State University; laptops for high school students; backpack/school supplies for elementary school students; book stipends and graduation awards for previous scholarship recipients.
Charlotte's Web Enrichment Center, Inc.	\$5,000	Charlotte's Web Enrichment Center, Inc. will use grant funds to facilitate a 3-Day Violence Prevention Engagement series.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc	\$22,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc will use the grant funds to provide a community event for the benefit of Prince George's County residents. The event will be a concert featuring the musical artists of Motown.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc. will use the grant funds for the Pathways to Career Success Program that graduates students on time college, career, and workforce ready. This year, this program is expanded to include a 12-month crime and violence pilot for youth and their parents.
Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association Dollars for Scholars	\$4,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association Dollars for Scholars will use grant funds to provide support to the areas of Temple Hills, Suitland, Oxon Hill and Ft. Washington within Prince George's County Maryland.
JustUs Initiative	\$10,000	JustUs Initiative will use grant funds to support two of its programs, Just Us Transitions Program and Just US Listening Sessions. Both are designed to provide wraparound services to youth ages 14 to 24, particularly adjudicated youth and formerly incarcerated.
Legacy Premier Foundation, Inc.	\$100,000	Legacy Premier Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to expand its positive youth development programs to include a new component that uses self-actualization strategies, a holistic approach of integrated disciplines (mental health, medical health, counseling, education, social work, information technology, technology, job coaching, and law), and that engages youth and adolescents in self-defining services.
Old School Boxing Athletic Center, Inc.	\$10,000	Old School Boxing Athletic Center Inc will use grant funds to offset the cost of rent and enable old school boxing to sponsor members participating in national tournaments.
PGC Police Dept D1 Citizens Advisory Council	\$2,000	Prince George's County Police Dept D1 Citizens Advisory Council will use grant funds to provide support to County council District 5.
River Jordan Project, Inc.	\$10,000	River Jordan Project, Incorporated will use grant funds for monthly food distributions to food insecure individuals and families.
Streetcar Suburbs Publishing, Inc	\$2,000	Streetcar Suburbs Publishing, Inc will use the grant funds to help fund improvements to our 3 newspapers that flow from our current strategic planning process (improvements could include more Spanish-language content and more coverage of county government and the school system).
The Better Family Inc.	\$7,500	The Better Family, Inc. will use grant funds in part to help with their site rental and to cover the rental for the equipment needed for the STEM Zone.
The Training Source, Inc.	\$2,000	The Training Source, Inc. will use grant funds for general operating support for adult job training, youth leadership; youth job readiness training; college and career planning; community support services (SNAP application assistance, domestic violence survivor support etc.); employer staffing and training, etc.
