| Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc. | \$3,000 | Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc. will use grant funds to provide support for an event to celebrate the 3.8 Trolley Trail which connects Hyattsville, Riverdale Park and College Park directly and the larger regional trail network. In 2023, over 1,500 participants, 50 businesses, participated in a full day of activities. |
| Art Works Studio School Inc., dba Art Works Now | \$6,000 | Art Works Studio School Inc., dba Art Works Now will use grant funds to provide support on site at Art Works Now and at partner locations in PGC such as Thomas Stone Elementary School, Mt. Rainier. |
| BCAUSEICAN, Inc. | \$2,000 | BCAUSEICAN, Inc will use grant funds to purchase software and equipment and compensate their staff. |
| C&J Migrant Solutions Foundation, Inc. | \$3,000 | C&J Migrant Solutions Foundation, Inc will use the grant funds to create social service programs, behavioral health services, Citizenship and ESL classes. Funds will also allow migrants to have direct access to attorneys within the foundation that handle immigration cases. |
| Centro de Apoyo Familiar (CAF) | \$5,000 | Centro de Apoyo Familiar (CAF) will use grant funds to serve minority communities through its Asset Building Program targeting low-income families in Prince George's County. |
| Coalition for African Americans in Performing Arts | \$4,000 | Coalition for African Americans in Performing Arts will use grant funds to provide support to sustain, maintain, and advance county-wide programming at the CAAPA Cultural Center, which houses the Arts Academy, WoW (WithOutWords) Deaf Arts, 60+ARTS (Active Retired Talented Seniors), CAAPA C.A.M.P.S. |
| Coalition for Public Safety Training In Schools, Inc | \$3,000 | Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds to develop an electrical pre-apprenticeship program and provide services driver education scholarships to PGCPD Fire Science cadets and Career and Technical Education (CTE) students. |
| Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc. | \$4,000 | Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services. Legal matters include domestic violence protective orders, estate planning for seniors, expungement of criminal records, family law, and other civil matters. |

| Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc. dba ECO City Farms | \$2,000 | Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc. dba ECO City Farms will use grant funds to work with municipalities and residents to promote healthy eating by offering sliding-scale cooking classes, reduced cost CSAs, and community conversations over healthy meals. |
| First Generation College Bound | \$2,000 | First Generation College Bound, Inc. will use grant funds to provide support to the general operating support FY24, to include program activities, telecommunications, technology, and salaries. |
