Overview of Prince George's County Memorial Library System

History

In 1902, the [State Library Commission](#) was authorized to develop public libraries throughout Maryland. The County Commissioners allocated funds to establish the [Prince George's County Memorial Library System](#) (PGCMLS) in 1946 as “a living memorial to those... who served in wars” under a law enacted by the State legislature. The Laurel Branch was the first library to become part of the System.

Currently, PGCMLS operates [19 regional branches](#), a 24/7 online library, and pop-up services throughout the County. The Library System also provides service at the County Correctional Center. PGCMLS has been fine-free since June 2020.

Leadership

PGCMLS is governed by a 7-member volunteer [Board of Library Trustees](#), which is appointed by the County Executive and approved by the County Council. This group serves as the policy-making body that guides the development of library services. The [PGCMLS Foundation](#) provides critical philanthropic support to the Library.

Recent Accomplishments and Future Initiatives

FY 2024 Accomplishments

- Conducted search and hired new Library system CEO, Dr. Mark Winston.
- Started construction on the Common Labs at Beltsville, Fairmount Heights, Largo-Kettering, and Oxon Hill.
- Construction began on the new Baden Branch Library.
- Offered digital literacy programs in English, Spanish, Dari, and Pashto to reduce the digital divide.

FY 2025 Initiatives

- Completion of a new strategic plan to guide the Library System over the next three to five years.
- Construction and/or renovation of all Commons Labs will be completed. The Labs are located at the Beltsville, Bladensburg, Fairmount Heights, Largo-Kettering, and Oxon Hill Branch Libraries.
- Start the required classification and compensation study.
- Delivery of the Library2Go: Career Connector vehicle funded by a Department of Labor grant.
- Surpass over one million books delivered to Prince George's County children through the Books from Birth program.



Programs

This section provides a breakdown of non-branch-specific Library programs. PGCMLS divides the programs into four (4) categories: 1) Books from Birth, 2) Summer Reading Program, 3) Branch Programming, and 4) Public Relations Special Programs.

In 2024, the Library hosted 6,915 programs with 153,725 participants.

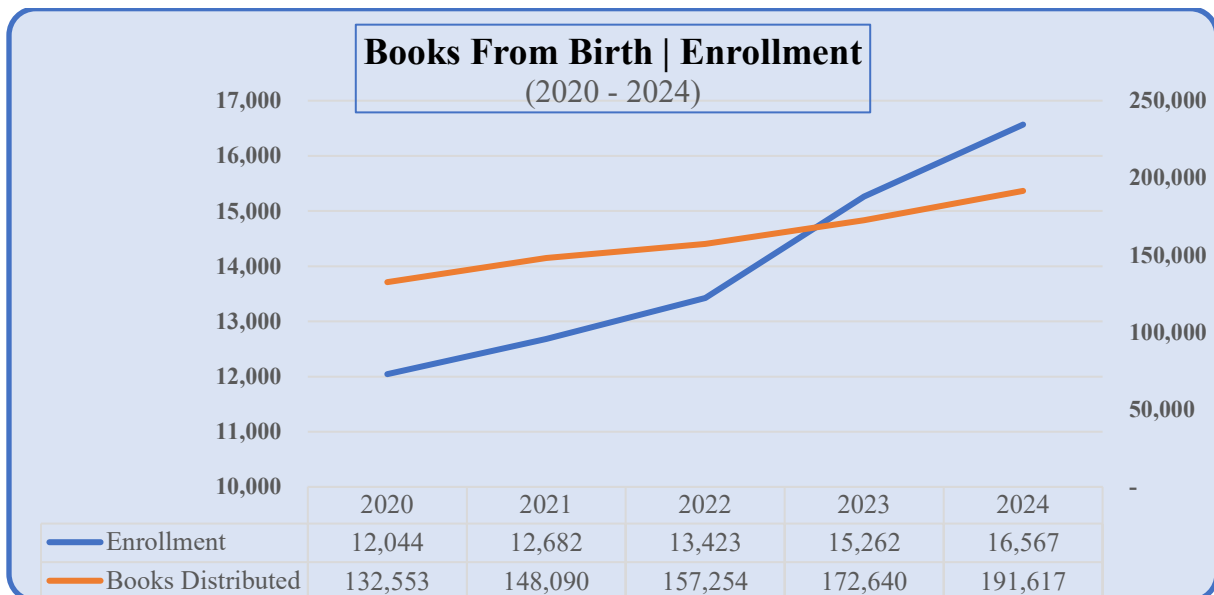
Books From Birth

FY 2024 funding: \$372,000² – 85% of Public Services and Program budget.³

FY 2025 funding: \$329,810 – 84% of Public Services and Program budget.

The Library's ***Ready to Read: Books from Birth Program***, the primary programmatic expense of the System, was officially rolled out during FY 2019 as part of the County's Newborn Initiative. The program enables children to develop a home library of 60 books by the time they reach kindergarten and encourages parents to read with and to their children. In 2024, enrollment totaled 16,567, with 191,617 books distributed. The Library continues to express concern over the long-term affordability of the Program as enrollment continues to exceed budget every year since FY 2022. In December 2024, PGCMLS distributed their one millionth book.

The table below shows the total enrollment and number of books distributed yearly. While the COVID-19 pandemic affected in-person programming and activities, enrollment in the program did not have the typical slump in 2021 that many other charts in this report show.



² Funding levels for both fiscal years refer to the Operating budget only. Does not include grants or private donations used to fund the program.

³ The Public and Program Services budget was reduced by \$48,000 between FY 2024 and FY 2025.



Summer Reading Program

FY 2024 funding: \$25,000 – 6.0% of Public Services and Program budget.

FY 2025 funding: \$19,000 – 5% of Public Services and Program budget.

The Summer Reading Program, in collaboration with the Washington Nationals, called "Summer Prince George's," engages customers of all ages in library activities, such as borrowing materials, attending events, and reading. The funds cover hiring local educational performers and presenters for all branches and purchasing supplies.

Hired presenters in 2024 included:

- Science Guys of Baltimore
- National Aquarium in Baltimore
- Echoes of Nature
- Eco Adventures
- Book Crawl events with professional entertainers for adults

The budget line also funds purchasing incentives such as t-shirts, tote bags, and books. The Washington Nationals also provide tickets to home baseball games.

Branch Programming

FY 2024 funding: \$34,200 – 8% of Public Services and Program budget.

FY 2025 funding: \$34,200 – 9% of Public Services and Program budget.

Branch programming budgets support presenters and performers and materials and supplies for each area and branch to use at their discretion and need. The organizations hired are vetted and serve



the needs of those local branch communities. The Outreach and Partnerships Specialists helped coordinate 660 collaborative programs across the library system in 2024.

This line item supports the work of the heritage teams by funding paid presenters with particular cultural, historical, artistic, and academic expertise to represent diverse perspectives best and provide rich context and content. These initiatives include Hispanic Heritage, Black Culture, Asian Pacific American Heritage, Native and Indigenous Culture, LGBTQ+, and the variety of intersectionality therein. These funds also support programs on health and wellness, spoken word and poetry, author visits, and many more. \$20,000 of the \$42,100 from this budget in FY 2024 was used to support these programs. The number of programs, by category, can be found under the 'Programs' section above.

In FY 2024, Area Directors were allocated \$20,000 of the \$42,100 Branch Programming budget to use at their discretion to support branch-level programming. This equal distribution of programming supply funds, starting in FY 2022, helped to address long-standing inequities between branches with Friends of the Library groups that provided financial support and those without. It empowers branch-level staff to develop and deliver programs that meet their communities' specific needs and interests. FY 2024 funding totaled \$1,000 per branch, including the County Correctional Center's law library. These funds are used to support programs and outreach efforts to customers of all ages. The branches' items include craft supplies, STEM supplies, board games, film licenses, 3D printing filaments, puppets, and ukulele kits.

Public Relations Special Programs and Events

FY 2024 funding: \$11,000 – 12% of Public Relations and Program budget.

FY 2025 funding: \$9,000 – 22% of Public Relations and Program budget.⁴

The Public Relations Special Programs and Events budget supports major system-wide initiatives and one-time events like branch grand openings. Many of these programs support the initiatives outlined in branch programming. In 2024, special programs and events included a Festival of Cultures, Pride events including a Rainbow Festival, and Asian Pacific American Heritage programs. The budget is also used for supplies, printing and marketing, and ASL interpreting for events and programs.

Library Branches

The Memorial Library System manages 19 branches and the County Correctional Center's law library. The branches are divided into four geographic regions, each overseen by an Area Director.

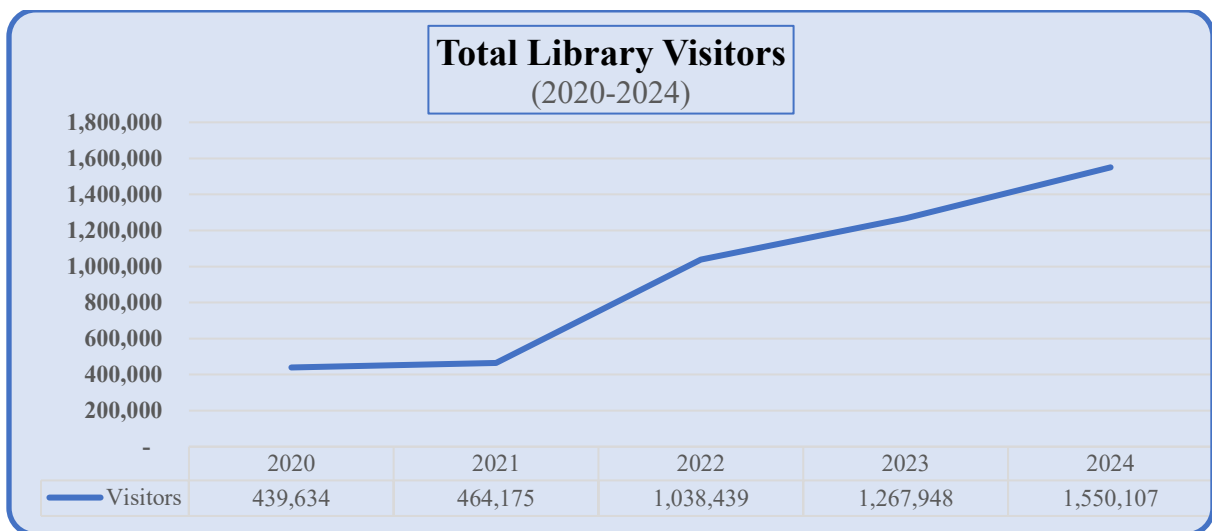

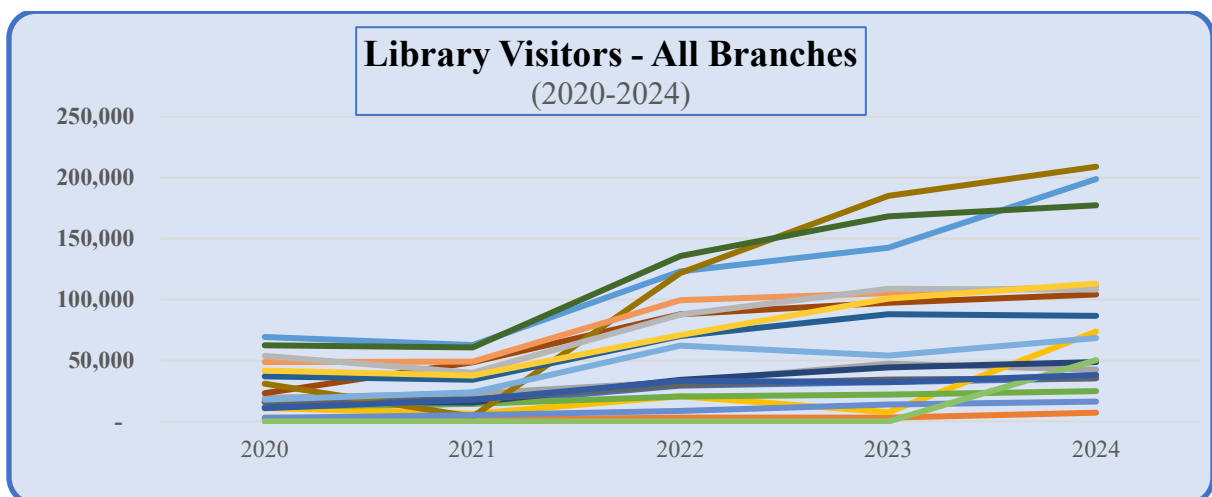
System-Wide Data

Total Library Visitors

By Total Library visitors, the chart below shows that total visitors decreased at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and are rebounding to pre-pandemic levels. The yearly increase is attributed to several factors, including returning in-person services after the COVID-19 pandemic branch closures and reopening larger branches such as Surratts-Clinton, Hyattsville, and Bladensburg. Additionally, the increase in programming has brought more residents into the branch buildings.



Visitors to all Library branches follow a similar pattern of rebound from the COVID-19 pandemic branch closures and subsequent increase as restrictions began to ease. The brown line showing a sharp spike since 2021 is the Hyattsville Branch Library. The Bowie and Laurel branches are the other two with high in-person traffic.⁵

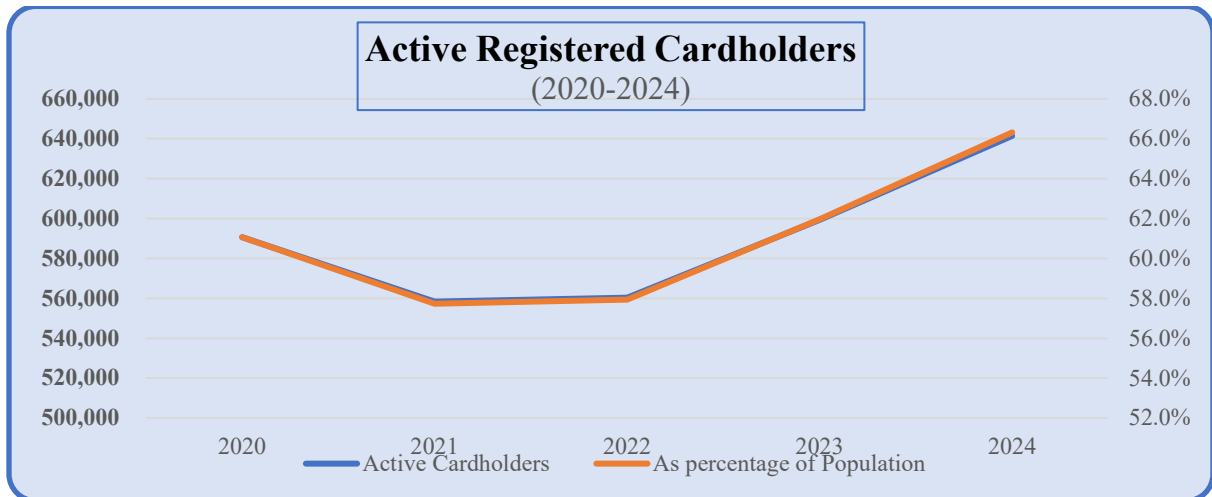

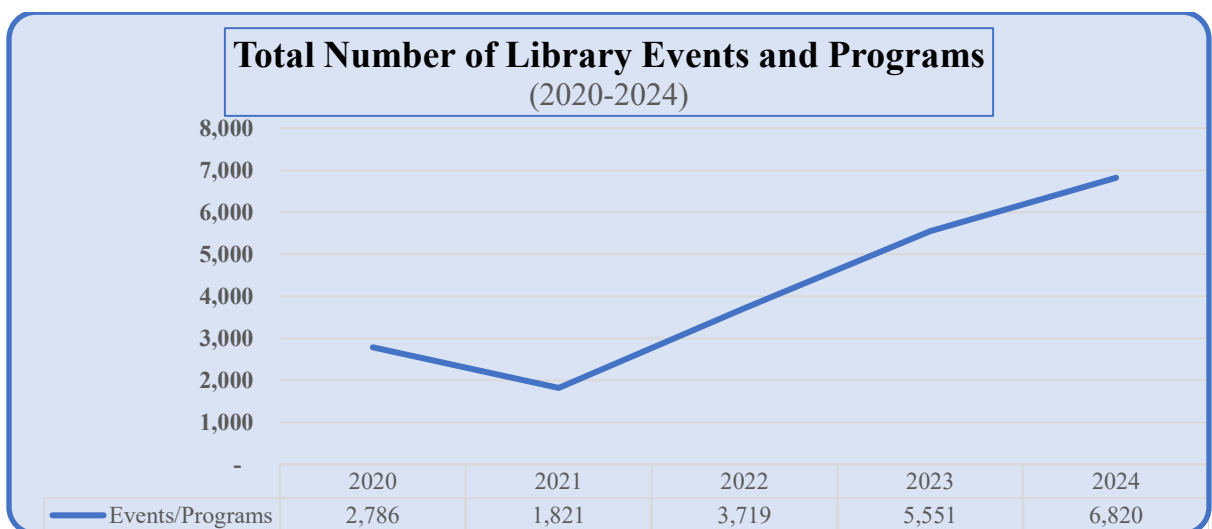
Active Registered Cardholders

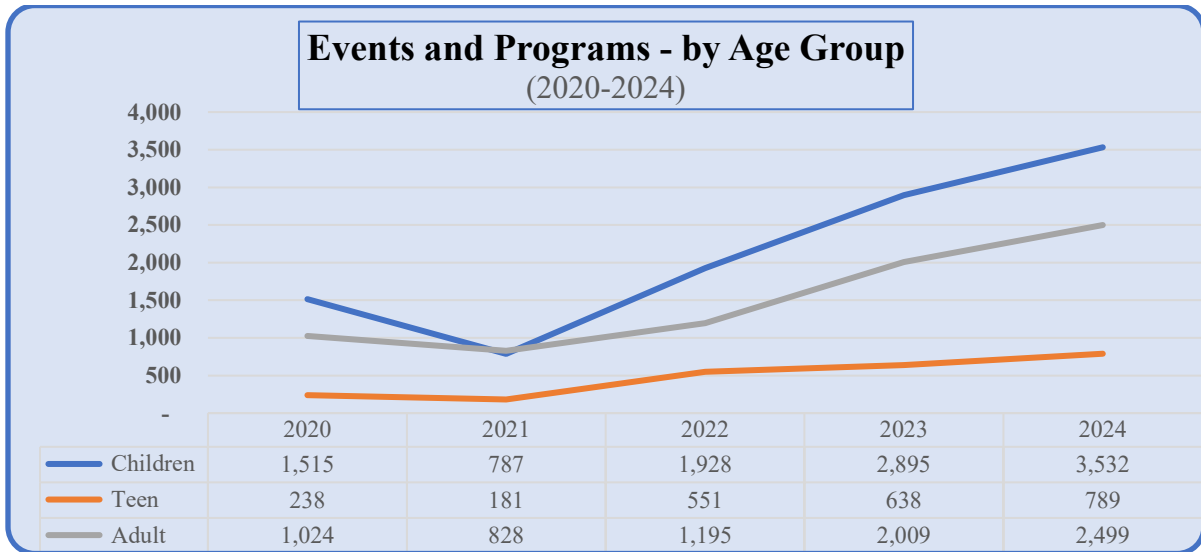


Programs and Events

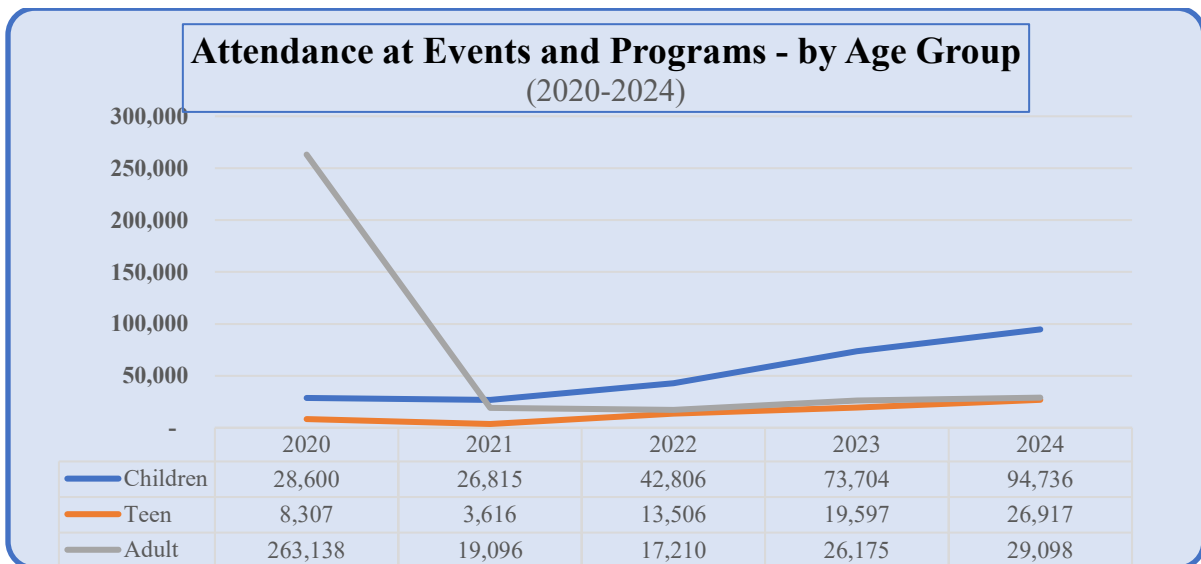
The total number of Library events and programs has trended upward since 2021, with children's programming being the demographic group with the highest number of programs. Teen programs are the least common type of programming available at all branches except the Bowie Branch Library. PGCMLS has noted that increasing teen programming will be a priority in 2025 and future years. The increased programming by PGCMLS can be correlated with an increase in attendance and in-person visits to local branches.

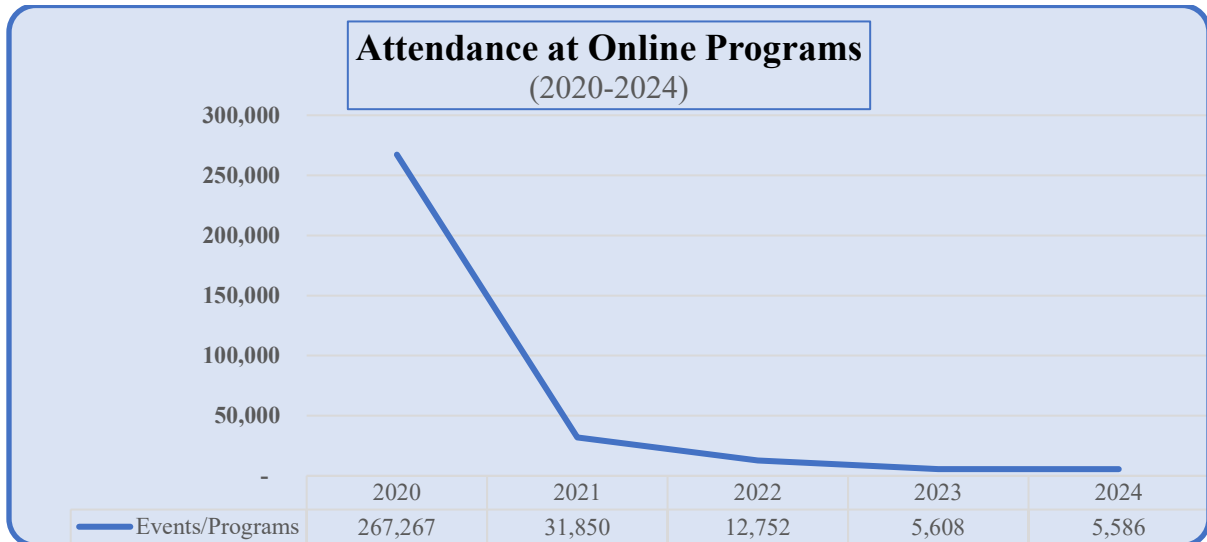
The chart below shows the total online and in-person attendance for events and programs, broken down by demographic group. The high attendance in adult programs in 2020 was due to the popularity of an online conversation by author Ibram X. Kendi.



All branches are required to provide weekly “Ready 2 Read” story times. Each branch also offers regular programs for elementary students (ages 5-12). This should include *at least* one STEM and one Literacy program per month. Programs for teens are expected to be offered at branches with a significant number of teen customers. The Library System is working towards expanding this expectation to all branches to better serve teenagers. Adult programming is offered at each branch with the needs and interests of this population in mind.

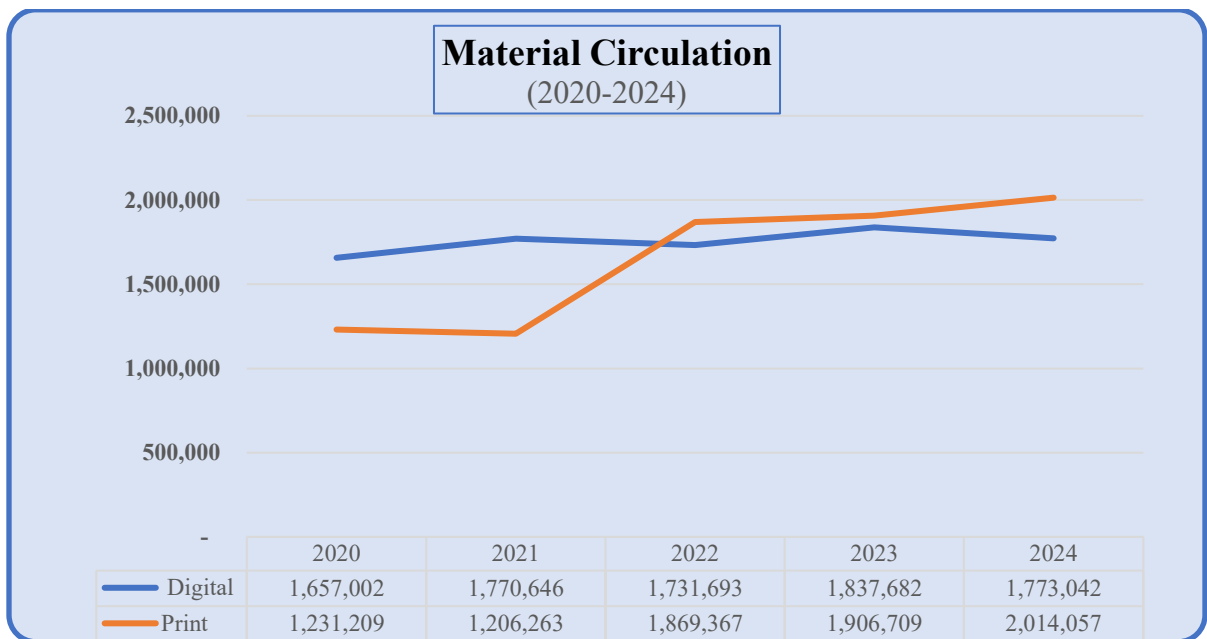


Attendance at online programs follows a similar trend to that of all programs and events. The high attendance in 2020 is due to the conversation mentioned above. The high attendance in adult programs in 2020 was due to the popularity of online conversations by author Ibram X. Kendi, as well as increased online programming due to the COVID-19 pandemic branch closures.



Material Circulation

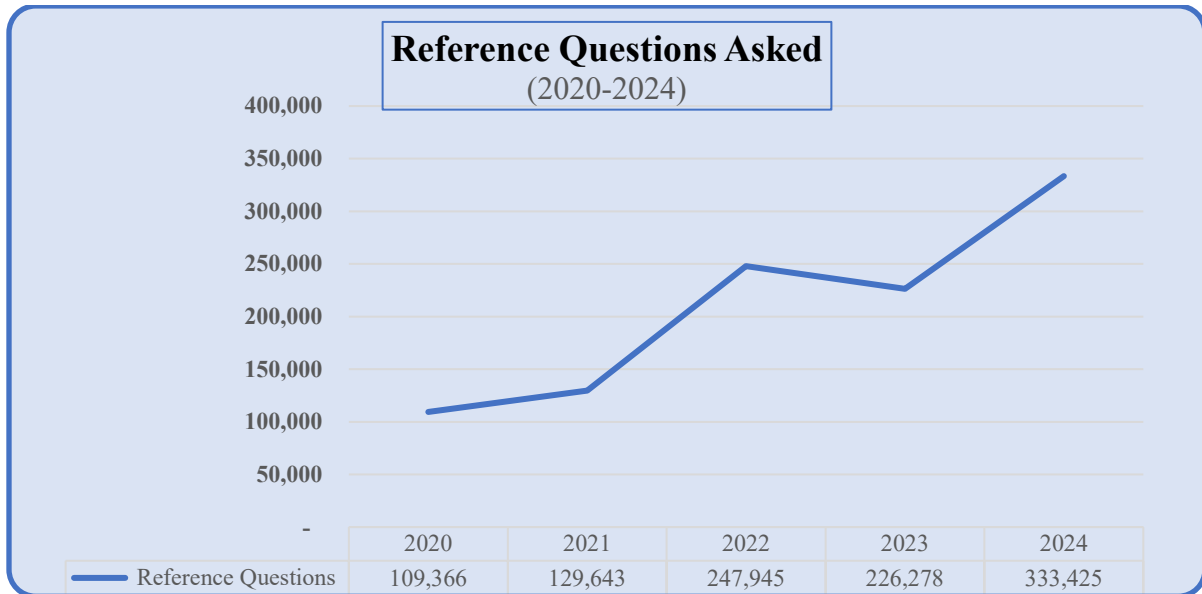

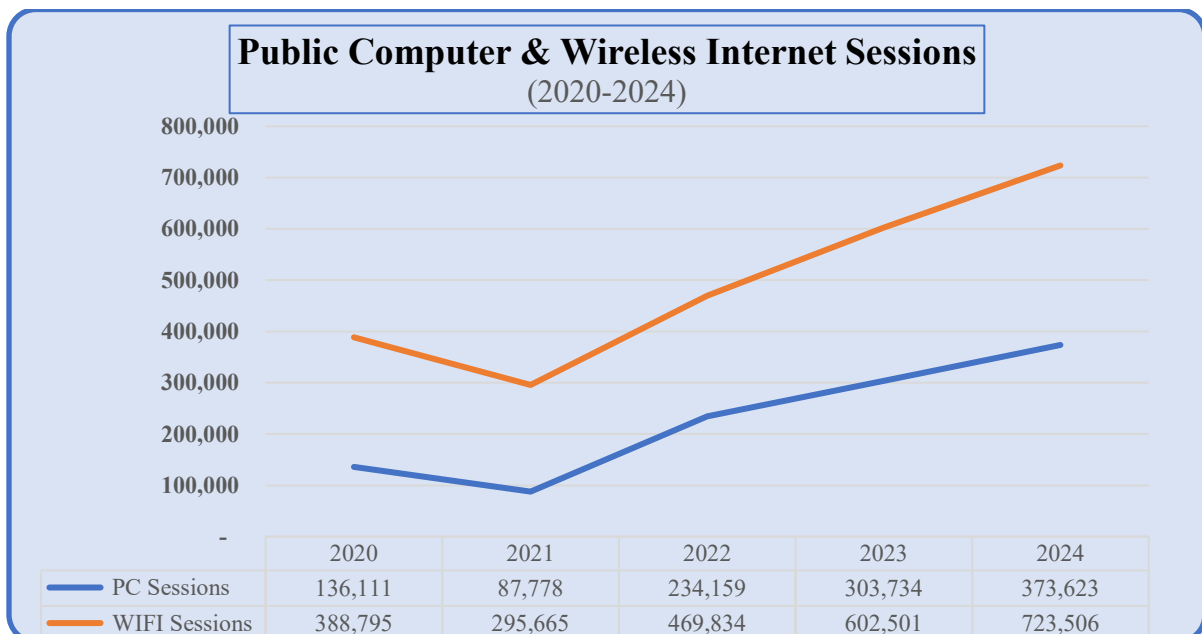

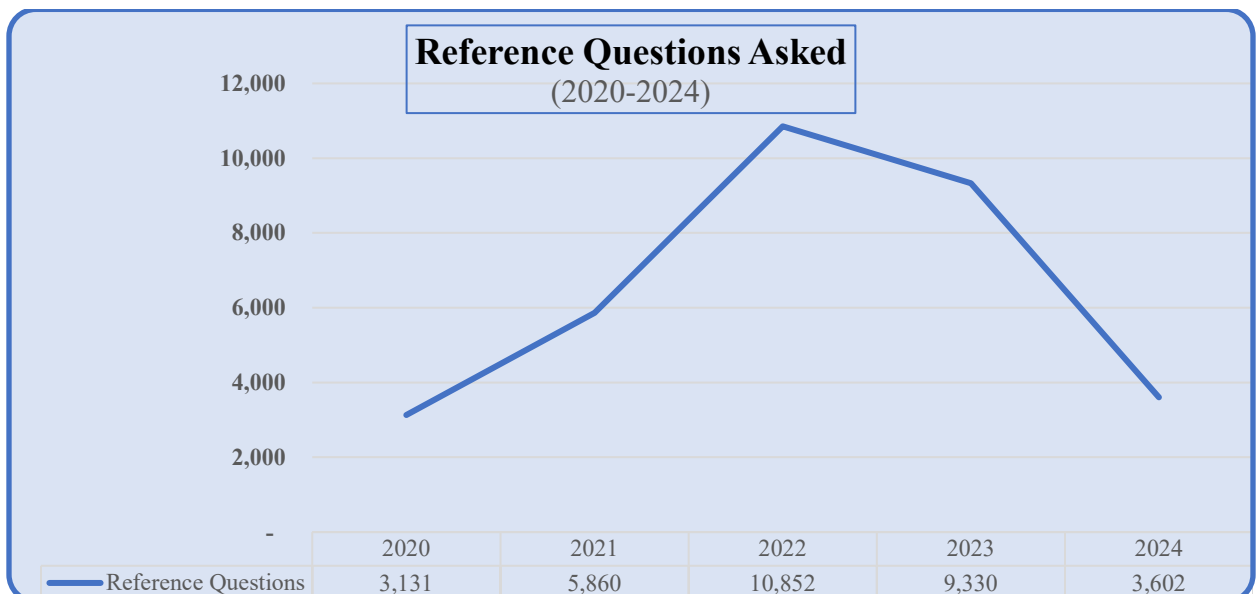

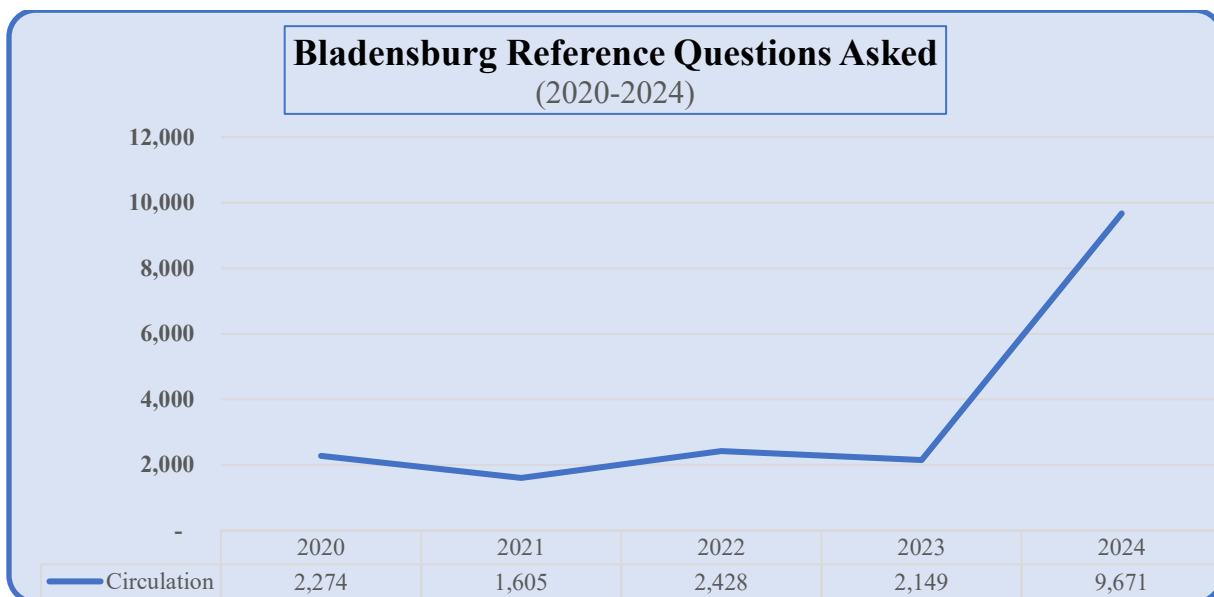
