- Engages residents through focused messaging




Campaign Highlights Since 2021

- Highlights various lifestyles and populations.











Web Banners




- Ads that can be viewed and clicked on in a web browser.

- Geofencing for some ads extends to DC areas where Prince George's County residents may frequent (e.g. gay clubs or bars)



Most STIs can be treated once detected, but you have to know you have one. Get tested at the Prince George's County Health Department, by calling (301) 583-3150.




Targeted prevention messaging is played on Urban One radio stations throughout the county.

Bus Shelter Ads in the Community





Positive Voices Podcast
