C & J Migrant Solutions Foundation, Inc.	\$4,000	C & J Migrant Solutions Foundation, Inc. will use the grant funds to sustain and expand ESL and citizenship classes, while also establishing a Technology Lab and GED program. These initiatives will empower our migrant community by providing essential education for those with limited schooling.
Charles H. Flowers High School	\$2,000	Charles Herbert Flowers High School will use the grant funds to purchase additional weight room equipment to enhance the safety and training of our student-athletes. We also plan to acquire a storage container to securely store equipment, ensuring it remains protected and reusable year after year.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$5,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. (CPSTS) will use grant funds to educate, advocate and foster career training in schools and support workforce development for the benefit of the local community. CPSTS will provide technical training opportunities.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use the grant funds to support two major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to persons in need of assistance that live in the county.
Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc.	\$5,000	Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc. will use grant funds to continue to navigate and promote stabilization and sustainability services for older victims of elder abuse, mental health issues, financial exploitation, and peer-to-peer companionship due to isolation and loneliness.
Community Legal Services of Prince George County	\$5,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc. will provide mobile legal services to reach under-served areas of the county lacking access to legal services. Legal matters include domestic violence, estate planning for seniors, expungement, family law, and other civil legal matters.
Community Mediation Maryland LLC	\$2,000	Community Mediation Maryland LLC will use grant funds to supplement the cost of hiring a bi-lingual Spanish speaking outreach/ mediation coordinator, and providing compensation to support staff, recruitment & training of bi-lingual and spanish speaking only mediators & interpreters, and the translation of recruitment & training materials.
Court Appointed Special Advocate Prince George's County	\$3,000	Court Appointed Special Advocate Prince George's County will use grant funds to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of 190 foster youth. Grant funds will support managing volunteers from throughout the County to be matched with youth who come from every district in the County.
End Time Harvest Ministries	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use the grant funds to fund the Pathways to Career Success Program that graduates students on time college, career, and workforce ready. These funds will also fund student scholarships and summer internships.
Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc. dba ECO City Farms	\$5,000	Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc. dba ECO City Farms will use grant funds to support the salaries of their farmers who grow food for the local community.
Fairmont Heights High School Football Alumni Association	\$5,000	Fairmont Heights High School Football Alumni Association will use the grant funds to provide pre-game meals for 50 FHHS varsity and junior varsity football players during the 2025-2026 school year. These nutritious meals, served before the game, help sustain players (many from low-income families) through games that last until approximately 9:30 p.m.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use the grant funds to provide freshly prepared home delivered Medically Tailored Meals, Groceries and Medical Nutrition Therapy to neighbors living with serious illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, HIV/AIDS, sickle cell, etc. who cannot shop or cook for themselves.
Homeless Children Playtime Project	\$2,000	Homeless Children Playtime Project will use grant funds to support trauma- informed play programs and camps for children experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity at Playtime's programs in Prince George's County. In 2024, they served more than 225 Prince George's County children.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$3,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc. will use the grants funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness and hope.
Jamaur Law Foundation , Inc.	\$1,500	Jamaur Law Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to sustain and grow two signature financial literacy programs: SMART MONEY Training Series and SMART MONEY for Veterans Training Series. Jamaur Law Foundation, Inc. is a community organization that provides opportunities and financial literacy programming to improve economic well-being and close the racial wealth gap that exists in our communities. We promote sustainable practices that ensure long-term economic stability and social and environmental justice. Our financial literacy programming educates young people, adults, and veterans on finances and promotes upward economic mobility, housing security, and workforce development. By teaching our community members about financial literacy, we help to improve joblessness, homelessness and indebtedness. The SMART MONEY and SMART MONEY for Veterans Training Series are 100% free of charge to program participants.

KCP YSA will use grant funds to help cover costs for refs/ EMTs at games, financial management, a new website, equipment, signs, background checks and insurance.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$1,000	Liberty's Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to support our after-school programs of civic engagement, held at Parkdale High School and Charles Carroll Middle School, held twice annually, in 10-week sessions, running from March to May and again from October to December.
Prince George's Child Resource Center dba Child Resource Connect	\$10,000	Prince George's Child Resource Center dba Child Resource Connect will use grant funds for general operating support to sustain their core operations, including the continued delivery of their full suite of programs: home visiting, family support center, early childhood mental health, child care support services and training.

Progressive Life Center	\$6,500	Progressive Life Center will use grant funds to expand and enhance PLC's economic mobility programming in the County, engaging individuals from diverse age groups. The service will complement and build upon their existing County services including family preservation and domestic violence programs.
SheRises, Inc.	\$3,000	SheRises Inc. will use the grant funds for mentoring, coaching, Mommy Closet and Resource Support.
The Arc of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$1,500	The Arc of Prince George's County will use the grant funds to support the Arc's programming that assist youth with IU/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, along with supporting individuals with I/DD who are not receiving DDA benefits, in particular Spanish-speaking individuals.
Vine Corps, Inc.	\$6,000	Vine Corps, Inc. will use the grant funds for comprehensive youth development, behavioral health support, and violence prevention programming for tee, including salaries, youth leadership stipends, insurance, equipment supplies, transportation, IT, training, and other activity costs.
Washington D.C. Meals on Wheels DBA Meals on Wheels NW Prince George's, Inc.	\$2,500	Meals on Wheels NW Prince George's will use grant funds to cook, pack, and deliver hot, fresh meals five days a week to homebound community members in Prince George's County.
WETATi Academy, Inc.	\$1,000	WETATi Academy, Inc will use the grant funds to implement WETATi Academy's practical entrepreneurship education programs, which focus on financial literacy, entrepreneurship, workforce development & STEM. The program is designed to equip low-to-moderate income youth and community members with essential skills and knowledge to foster economic empowerment.
White Rose Foundation, Inc.	\$5,000	White Rose Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to sponsor 40 students to become members of Patriots/NSBE Jr Chapter; to sponsor district teams and compete in the Patriots competitions for school year 2025-2026. To provide support for Patriot Technology events.
Woodlawn Community Association, Inc.	\$500	Woodlawn Community Association, Inc. will use grant funds to bring health- wellness programs to senior residents of the community that are conveniently held at the Woodlawn Center or facilities in the community.
