<a href="#">BCAUSEICAN, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	BCAUSEICAN, Inc. will use grant funds to achieve the goals of its high impact STEM programming delivered at Prince George's County Public School sites, BCAUSEICAN will need to purchase software, equipment and compensate its staff.
<a href="#">Brothers and Sisters, Inc.</a>	\$2,000	Brothers and Sisters, Inc. will use grant funds to provide essential kits for homeless veterans, impoverished families, and at-risk individuals in the DMV region. We also would like to expand our job training and mentoring programs.
<a href="#">C&amp;J Migrant Solutions Foundation Inc</a>	\$5,000	C&J Migrant Solutions Foundation Inc. will use grant funds to sustain and expand their ESL and citizenship classes, while also establishing a Technology Lab and GED program. These initiatives aim to empower the migrant community by addressing gaps in education and equipping individuals with critical skills.
<a href="#">Central American Resource Center – CARECEN</a>	\$5,000	Central American Resource Center – CARECEN will use the grant funds to provide high-quality legal immigration services for residents across Prince George's County, including TPS and DACA renewals, work permits, family petitions, etc.
<a href="#">Charles Herbert Flowers High School</a>	\$6,250	Charles Herbert Flowers High School will use the grant funds to purchase additional weight room equipment to enhance the safety and training of our student-athletes. We also plan to acquire a storage container to securely store equipment, ensuring it remains protected and reusable year after year.
<a href="#">Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men</a>	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support our two major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to persons in need of assistance that live in the county.
<a href="#">Community Legal Services of Prince George County</a>	\$1,750	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc. will provide mobile legal services to reach under-served areas of the county lacking access to legal services. Legal matters include domestic violence, estate planning for seniors, expungement, family law, and other civil legal matters.
<a href="#">Community Youth Advance</a>	\$5,000	Community Youth Advance, Inc. will use the grant funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
<a href="#">End Time Harvest Ministries</a>	\$2,500	End Time Harvest Ministries will use the grant funds to fund the Pathways to Career Success Program that graduates students on time college, career, and workforce ready. These funds will also fund student scholarships and summer internships.

The program will focus on high school seniors, equipping them with a required certification for careers in healthcare and helping them to address workforce shortages in home healthcare and senior care sectors across the county.
