| Alice Ferguson Foundation, Inc. | \$3,000 | Alice Ferguson Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to cover critical unfunded costs for PGCPSS students attending STEM-based field trips during the 2025-2026 school year. This grant ensures full participation in STEM education aligned with Maryland environmental literacy standards. |
| Antioch Baptist Church of Clinton, MD | \$37,000 | Antioch Baptist Church of Clinton, MD will use grant funds to supplement and extend their current food pantry. Specifically, we will target recently laid off federal workers thereby allowing them to direct discretionary food funds to other basic needs and job searching to rebuild their livelihoods. |
| Blake Bozeman Foundation | \$3,500 | Blake Bozeman Foundation will use grant funds to support youth development programs through sports, financial literacy, mental health communication and community service initiatives in countywide- Prince George's. |
| Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. | \$16,500 | Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. (CPSTS) will use grant funds to educate, advocate and foster career training in schools and support workforce development for the benefit of the local community.
