Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc.	\$3,000	Anacostia Trials Heritage Area, Inc. will use grant funds to support a growing event to celebrate the 3.8 mile Trolley Trail which connects Hyattsville, Riverdale Park and College Park to the DMV's regional trail network. In 2024, over 2,700 participants, 80 businesses, participated in a full day of activities.
Art Works Now	\$8,000	Art Works Now will use the grant funds to provide critical support to subsidized program/operational costs so AWN can continue to provide meaningful arts education that positively impacts/enriches the lives of the participants of all ages, especially those of the most vulnerable populations across PGC.
Bishop McNamara High School	\$1,000	Bishop McNamara High School, Inc. will use the grant funds to provide essential assistance to students whose families are facing financial hardship. Funds will help cover critical expenses such as tuition, student fees, books, SAT/ACT workshops or testing fees-ensuring that students can continue their education.
C&J Migrant Solutions Foundation Inc	\$4,000	C&J Migrant Solutions Foundation Inc. will use grant funds to sustain and expand their ESL and citizenship classes, while also establishing a Technology Lab and GED program. These initiatives aim to empower the migrant community by addressing gaps in education and equipping individuals with critical skills.
Carole Highlands Neighborhood Association	\$1,000	Carole Highlands Neighborhood Association will use grant funds for communication flyers and community events, particularly around education for sustainable environmental efforts (litter reduction), clean water (rain gardens) and supporting pollinators (gardens, bee boxes, etc.).
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts	\$5,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA) will use grant funds to bridge the accessibility gap in performing arts, bringing transformative cultural expression to underserved residents of Prince George's County.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$4,000	Coalition For Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc (CPSTS) will use grant funds to educate, advocate and foster career training in schools and support workforce development for the benefit of the local community.
Court Appointed Special Advocate Prince George's County	\$4,000	Court Appointed Special Advocate Prince George's County will use grant funds to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of 190 foster youth. Grant funds will support managing volunteers from throughout the County to be matched with youth who come from every district in the County.
Ebenezer COG Community Outreach Ministries	\$1,500	Ebenezer COG Community Outreach Ministries will use the grant funds to assist with our 9th Annual Save A City Event which provides Free Groceries, Free Health Care Screenings and Free Back to School Supplies for over 1300 patrons. Also to assist with procuring supplies for our weekly food pantry that serves over 350 families weekly.

First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$2,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for general operating support in FY25 to include salaries, contractors, insurance, rent, telecommunications, printing, supplies, travel, staff and board of directors training, memberships, legal fees and Alliance activities.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$2,000	Food & Friends will use the grant funds to provide freshly prepared home delivered Medically Tailored Meals, Groceries and Medical Nutrition Therapy to neighbors living with serious illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, HIV/AIDS, sickle cell, etc. who cannot shop or cook for themselves.
Good Intentions Foundation, Inc.	\$2,000	Good Intentions Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to support food and clothing distributions, and financial literacy workshops, scholarships program for High School Seniors, and enhancing community impact and partnerships in Prince George's County.

La Clinica del Pueblo, Inc.	\$3,000	La Clinica del Pueblo, Inc. will use grant funds to meet the healthcare needs of Latino families in Prince George's County through the provision of comprehensive primary care and mental health services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate for low-income, uninsured, LEP residents.
Latin American Youth Center	\$5,000	Latin American Youth Center will use the grant funds to support the Latin American Youth Center/ Maryland Multicultural Youth Center's (LAYC/MMYC) Prince George's County programs such as afterschool tutoring and academic enrichment, summer camps, housing, GED classes, and workforce development programs.
Next Generation Youth Programs, Inc.	\$1,000	Next Generation Youth Programs, Inc. will use grant funds to support the College Career Cru Program to provide valuable workshops, training material and individual support to PGCPS High school students and families. In Partnership with PGCPS Counselors to help students navigate entry to college.

Specifically, funding to support a contracted in-take navigator and to provide supplemental support for the cost of wrap-around services.

Streetcar Suburbs Publishing Inc	\$1,000	Streetcar Suburbs Publishing Inc. will use the grant funds to add Spanish-Language content to their three newspapers in Laurel, College Park, and Hyattsville.
