Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
Charles Herbert Flowers High School - Football Program (no website)	\$10,000	Charles Herbert Flowers High School - Football Program will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing football program uniforms, general football equipment, communications equipment and portable water coolers.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc. (CLS)	\$5,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to operating its Suitland Clinic outreach to seniors, addressing domestic violence and conducting its Foreclosure Prevention Project, as well as providing its other services.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$2,500	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting its Homework Club, Great Minds & Great Future Academy, College Access and College Retention programs for Prince George's County students in low- to moderate income families.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds for expenses related to medically-tailored, home-delivered meals to those who are too ill to procure or prepare food on their own. Funds will also be used for individualized nutrition counseling, including cooking classes, educational handouts, and presentations on nutrition related to cancer, diabetes, HIV / AIDS and other life-challenging illnesses.
Let Us Keep Engaged, Inc. dba LUKE Foundation	\$5,000	Let Us Keep Engaged, Inc. dba LUKE Foundation will use grant funds for expenses related to hosting its educational conference for students and parents, "I Want My Child to Do Better Than Me 2018 - Renewal for a Stronger Community" to be held at Bowie State University.
The 13th Man	\$5,000	The 13th Man will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting its signature event, The 13th Man Summer Classics, a four day, three night youth leadership enrichment camp to be held in College Park.
The Training Source, Inc.	\$5,000	The Training Source will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting workforce development, youth leadership and job readiness training programs, and community-based social supportive services for residents of Prince George's County.
