Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
ARC of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$1,000	ARC of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting all programs carried out by ARC for residents of Prince George's County with developmental and intellectual disabilities. More specifically, the funds will be used for costs in arts and recreation, for transportation, to hire a new job developer, for expanding workshops, internships and job training for transitioning youth, and adding a new Project SEARCH site in the northern part of the county in the next 18 months.
Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church	\$7,667	Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church will use grant funds for expenses related to buy turkeys and fixings to give away to those in need in District 1 in Prince George's County.
B-Roll Media and Arts, Inc.	\$2,000	B-Roll Media and Arts will use grant funds for expenses related to providing free-of-cost media arts training and education to under-resourced youth ages 13 to 21 and youth with diagnosed learning disabilities in Prince George's County.
City of College Parks - Youth and Family Services	\$2,000	City of College Parks - Youth and Family Services will use grant funds for expenses related to providing specialized, interactive programming for College Park's seniors with the purpose of reducing social isolation and enhancing their sense of purpose and belonging.
City of Laurel- Laurel Helping Hands	\$1,500	City of Laurel- Laurel Helping Hands will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing promotional items to advertise the agency's services. As a relatively new and unknown agency, it wants to let the community know that it provides a community-based, family-oriented counseling program dedicated to promoting responsible behavior and appropriate family management skills.
College Park Arts Exchange, Inc.	\$2,000	College Park Arts Exchange will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting arts in College Park in District 1, including Arts Drop-in and Seniors programming at Youth and Family Services, College Park Community Library, and other North College Park venues. Funds will directly support artists who are providing services to these programs, plus materials, including art supplies.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$1,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to operating its Suitland Clinic outreach to seniors, addressing domestic violence and conducting its Foreclosure Prevention Project, as well as providing its other services.
Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) / Prince George's County	\$1,000	Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) / Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of 180 foster children and youth in foster care.
Educational Video in Spanish, Inc. (EVS Communications)	\$2,000	Educational Video in Spanish, Inc. (EVS Communications) will use grant funds for expenses related to providing partial support for producing one episode of the public service television series, <i>Linea Directa</i> .
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$2,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds for expenses related to medically-tailored, home-delivered meals to those who are too ill to procure or prepare food on their own. Funds will also be used for individualized nutrition counseling, including cooking classes, educational handouts, and presentations on nutrition related to cancer, diabetes, HIV / AIDS and other life-challenging illnesses.
Laurel High School PTSA (no website)	\$2,000	Laurel High School PTSA will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing whiteboards for classrooms, for transportation costs and ticket purchases for a field trip to New York City to see an educational Broadway play and for expenses related to Grad Night celebration for the Class of 2019.
Laurel Senior Friendship Club, Inc.	\$1,000	Laurel Senior Friendship Club will use grant funds for expenses related to promoting programs for seniors, including paying dues for members 88+ years of age, for the April volunteer lunch, for the June special birthday lunch for members 88+ years of age, for the November veterans lunch and for the December holiday lunch.

<u>Lovely Ladies of Laurel, Inc.</u>	\$3,500	Lovely Ladies of Laurel will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting monthly community activities such as hosting educational and enrichment programs in the forms of Community Days, Walks for Breast Cancer and Diabetes, Mentoring Month and Black History Month.
<u>Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.</u>	\$3,000	Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area will use grant funds for expenses related to the home delivery of meals five days a week to eligible residents of Prince George's County.
<u>NAMI Prince George's County, MD Inc.</u>	\$1,000	NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to providing general operating support to continue the programs of support, education, community outreach, and a Helpline for County residents.
<u>Patrons for Peace Project, Inc.</u>	\$2,000	Patrons for Peace Project will use grant funds for expenses related to providing emergency assistance to the homeless and underserved who are residents in Prince George's County, including medical transportation, replacement identification, gas cards and / or rental assistance until SSI payments come through.
<u>Side by Side, Inc.</u>	\$3,500	Side by Side will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the continuation of the parental outreach program, Great Start, for an estimated 400 families at six public elementary schools in northern Prince George's County.
<u>Women's Community Club of Beltsville, MD, Inc. - No Website</u>	\$2,500	Women's Community Club of Beltsville will use grant funds for expenses related to purchasing gifts, food and supplies associated with its holiday program. Funds may also be used for scholarships, school supplies and community beautification.
<u>World Arts Focus, Inc. dba Joe's Movement Emporium</u>	\$1,000	World Arts Focus, Inc. dba Joe's Movement Emporium will use grant funds for expense related to conducting its "Resilient Cultures" Joe's 2018-2019 season program for Onstage at Joe's.
