Bullying

Bullying is a common experience for many children and adolescents. Surveys indicate that as many as half of all children are bullied at some time during their school years, and at least 10% are bullied on a regular basis.

Bullying can be physical or verbal. Boys tend to use physical intimidation or threats, regardless of the gender of their victims. Bullying by girls is more often verbal. Bullying has even been reported in online chat rooms, through e-mail and on social networking sites.

Children who are bullied experience real suffering that can interfere with their social and emotional development, as well as their school performance. Some victims of bullying have even attempted suicide rather than continue to endure such harassment and punishment.

Children and adolescents who bully thrive on controlling or dominating others. They have often been the victims of physical abuse or bullying themselves. Bullies may also be depressed, angry or upset about events at school or at home. Bullies often choose children who are passive, easily intimidated, or have few friends. Victims may also be smaller or younger, and have a harder time defending themselves.

If you suspect a student is bullying others, seek help for him or her as soon as possible. Without intervention, bullying can lead to serious academic, social, emotional and legal difficulties. Notify the child's parents as soon as possible. If the bullying continues, take appropriate disciplinary measures. You can also help by punishing the bullies and assisting the victim. Remember to refer the victim to their guidance counselor.

It's also important to respond in a positive and accepting manner. Let the student know it's not his or her fault, and that he or she did the right thing by telling you. Other specific suggestions include the following:

- Ask the student what he or she thinks should be done. What's already been tried? What worked and what didn't?
- Seek help from the student's teachers and school guidance counselor. Most bullying occurs at school. Use various methods to resolve the conflict such as peer mediation, conflict resolution, and anger management training, and increased adult supervision.
- Don't encourage the student to fight back. Instead, suggest that he or she try walking away to avoid the bully, and that they seek help from a teacher or administrator.
- Encourage the student to be with friends when traveling to and from school, during shopping trips, or on other outings. Bullies are less likely to pick on a child in a group.

If you notice that a student becomes withdrawn, depressed or reluctant to go to school, or if you see a decline in school performance, additional consultation or intervention may be required. A child and adolescent psychiatrist can help develop a strategy to deal with the bullying. Seeking professional assistance earlier can lessen the risk of lasting emotional consequences for student.

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Cyberbullying

Cyber Bullying: Statistics and Tips

In the 2003-04 school year, i-SAFE America surveyed students from across the country on a new topic: Cyber Bullying. It is a topic that not many adults were talking about. It turns out to be a topic all too familiar with students.

Bullying is no longer about the strong picking on the weak in the schoolyard. The physical assault has been replaced by a 24 hour per day, seven days a week online bashing. Savvy students are using Instant Messaging, e-mails, chat rooms and websites they create to humiliate a peer. No longer can parents count on seeing the tell-tale physical signs of bullying: a black eye, bloody lip, or torn clothes. But the damage done by cyber bullies is no less real, and can be infinitely more painful.

Statistics

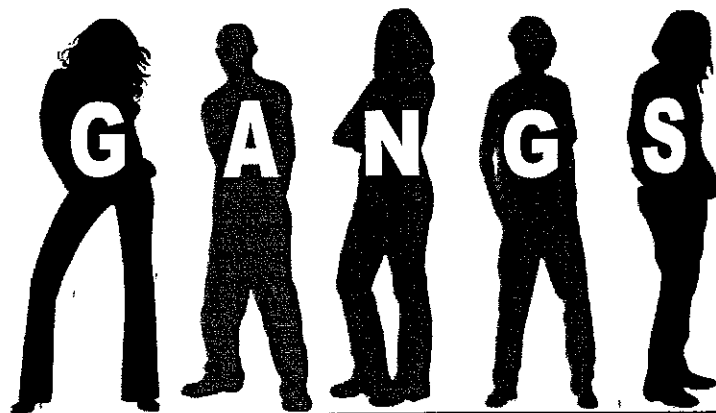
- 42% of kids have been bullied while online. 1 in 4 have had it happen more than once.
- 35% of kids have been threatened online. Nearly 1 in 5 have had it happen more than once.
- 21% of kids have received mean or threatening e-mail or other messages.
- 58% of kids admit someone has said mean or hurtful things to them online. More than 4 out of 10 say it has happened more than once.
- 53% of kids admit having said something mean or hurtful to another person online. More than 1 in 3 have done it more than once.
- 58% have not told their parents or an adult about something mean or hurtful that happened to them online.

Tips

- Tell a trusted adult about the bullying, and keep telling until the adult takes action.
- Don't open or read messages by cyber bullies.
- Tell your school if it is school related. Schools have a bullying solution in place.
- Don't erase the messages as they may be needed to take action.
- Protect yourself. Never agree to meet with the person or with anyone you meet online.
- If bullied through chat or instant messaging, the bully can often be blocked.
- If you are threatened with harm, inform the local police.

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What is a gang?

A gang is a group of people who claim some territory known as "turf" and use it to make money. Gangs make money through illegal activities such as drug trafficking and extortion.

Gangs are violent and dangerous. Although gangs seem more popular in urban neighborhoods, they are actually present everywhere. Do you know any kids in your neighborhood who belong to a gang? Don't let them talk you into thinking joining is a good idea. It could cost you your life.

Quick facts about gangs

- Gangs can be organized around race or ethnic groups, money-making activities, or territory.
- Gangs are normally made up of members eight to 22 years old.
- Gangs usually claim a territory within a community known as their "turf." Much of their time is spent fighting rival gangs to keep them out of this territory.
- Gang members wear particular items of clothing, such as bandanas or baseball caps of a specific color, or display gang-related tattoos or symbols.
- Gangs often use special hand signs or handshakes to tell others which gang they belong to.

Why do young people join gangs?

- To belong to a group
- To get protection
- To earn money
- To seek excitement

So what can I do if I don't join a gang?

- Join a sports team.
- Join an afterschool club.
- Hang out at your local community center.
- Get a part-time job.

Why should I avoid gangs?

- Joining a gang will not give you more protection; it could enhance your chance of being targeted as a victim.
- Gang members make far less money than those who do not join gangs.
- Gang members usually don't get a good education, making it hard to find a good job.
- Gangs are violent and dangerous, and members are also at a higher risk for getting arrested.

Take Action!

If gang members threaten you, don't overreact, stay cool, and tell a trusted adult.
If gang threats continue, tell your parents, law enforcement, or school officials.
Hang out with kids who are not involved and don't want to be involved in a gang.
Start a youth group to help clean graffiti or improve the neighborhood.

If you or someone you know is involved in a gang, talk to a trusted adult or call your local teen crisis hotline for help on getting out.

- Making you feel bad about yourself
- Calling you names
- Making you think you're crazy
- Playing mind games
- Humiliating you
- Making you feel guilty

Using Privilege

- Treating you like a servant
- Making all the big decisions
- Acting like the "Master"
- Being the one to define roles
- Making you unimportant
- Punishment for not "obeying"
- Ordering you around

Using Economic Abuse

- Preventing you from getting a job
- Making you ask for money
- Giving you an allowance
- Taking your money
- Secretive about income

Using Coercion and Threats

- Making or carrying out threats
- Threatening to leave, to commit suicide, to report you to welfare
- Making you drop charges
- Making you do illegal things

Using Intimidation

- Making you afraid (looks, gestures, actions)
- Smashing things
- Abusing Pets
- Displaying Weapons

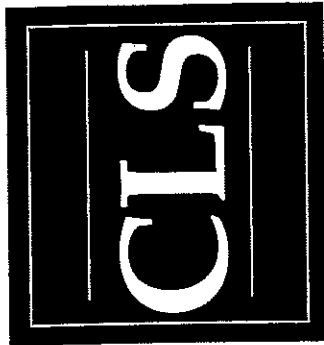

How do I apply for Eviction or Foreclosure Assistance?

When you call the numbers listed above, a staff member will advise you about the program and what information we need. He/she will also do a preliminary screening to see if you may be eligible to apply for financial assistance.

There are some questions you'll need to answer:

- Are you a Prince George's County resident?
- Why are you facing eviction or foreclosure?
- Do you hold the lease on the apartment or deed on the house?
- What is the total income of your household?
- What are your monthly expenses?
- Do you have sufficient income to cover monthly expenses after we help you?
- Was the crisis due to circumstances beyond your control?

- Are you willing to participate in counseling or other relevant activities that will prevent this crisis from happening again?

If you meet the preliminary eligibility criteria, an interview will be scheduled, and you will be informed about what type of information you'll need to supply to help us determine your eligibility.

The information you supply will be kept confidential.

You'll be asked for documents such as:

- Wage/pay stubs
- Property records or deeds
- Your current lease
- Delinquent rent or mortgage bill
- Birth certificates and social security numbers for you and members of your family
- The name and address of the landlord or mortgage company

Other documentation which may support your claim for assistance

Who is eligible to apply?

Prince George's County residents:

- In danger of eviction
- Homeowners facing foreclosure
- Homeless persons who need security deposits or first month's rent to move into permanent housing.

Emergency Assistance

Everyone experiences an emergency at one time or another. The Prince George's County Department of Social Services is here to help. The program assists **customers with dependent children under the age of 21** who face an immediate crisis and need help to resolve the situation. Emergency Assistance may cover but is not limited to, eviction notices, mortgage foreclosures, gas and electric turn-off notices and delinquent water bills.

You may be eligible for assistance if you meet these criteria:

- You are a Prince George's County resident
- You have a minor child or are pregnant (0-21 years of age) who has been living in the home for at least 6 months prior to the emergency
- You are related to the child by blood or marriage
- People living in the household are US citizens or lawful permanent citizens
- You are actively engaged in job search or employed
- You have not received emergency assistance in the past 12 months
- The emergency was not caused by your refusal to accept employment
- You did not voluntarily leave your employment without good cause.

You will need to provide the following information and documentation:

- Proof of County residency
- Valid identification
- Birth certificates and valid Social Security number for all members of your household
- A record of monthly expenses and bills paid for at least 30 days
- Proof of total household income: wage stubs for past 30 days, recent benefit letters from the Social Security Administration,
- Veterans Assistance Benefits, or the Unemployment Insurance Program
- Current checking or savings account statement and current balance
- Other pertinent information that may be required to process your application.



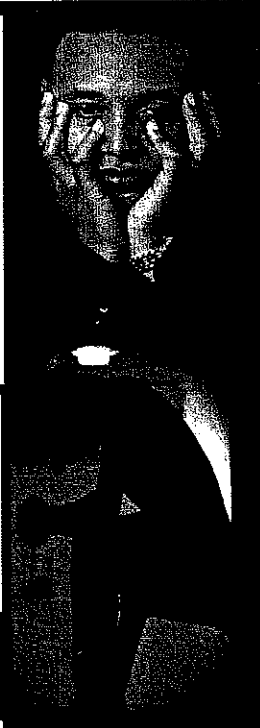

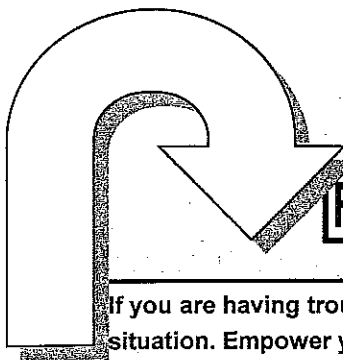

Foreclosure Prevention Checklist



If you are having trouble making your mortgage payments, be proactive and take charge of the situation. Empower yourself by getting fully acquainted with your mortgage, your finances and your resources. Start with this checklist so you know what you have done and what you still need to do. By doing so, you have a much better chance of remaining a homeowner.

- ◆ Contact your servicer if you are having trouble making your mortgage payments. The servicer is the company you make your mortgage payments to. Contact information can be found on your mortgage documents and on the servicer's Web site. A reputable credit counseling agency should also be able to help you find the appropriate contact information.
- ◆ Meet with a reputable lender to determine if refinancing is a viable option for you. Call the Maryland Hope Initiative Hotline 1.877.462.7555 or another reputable certified housing counselor agency.
- ◆ Open all mail that is sent to you by your mortgage company. Avoiding the situation will only make matters worse.
- ◆ Find copies of your original mortgage documentation, proof of income and the delinquency or foreclosure notices you receive. You will need these documents for discussions with your servicer and/or credit counselors.
- ◆ If your lender has gone into bankruptcy or is going out of business, contact the company you make your payments to so that you know who will be purchasing your loan. Obtain contact information for that new servicer so you can start making payments to the new lender.
- ◆ Seek legal counsel if you think you have been a victim of predatory lending. Call your local university to inquire if there is a legal clinic that can provide you with assistance or contact your state attorney general, the American Association of Residential Mortgage Regulators (www.aarmr.org), fair housing agency or the Federal Trade Commission (www.ftc.gov).
- ◆ Ask your creditors whether the relief you request will impact your credit standing and credit score in a negative way. If so, ask for any alternative that will not impact your credit standing.

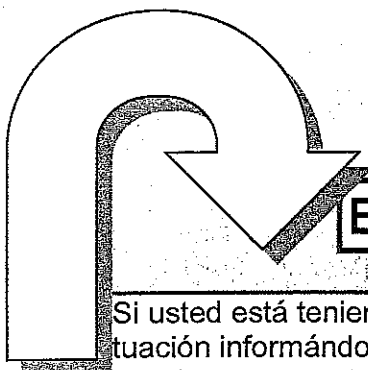

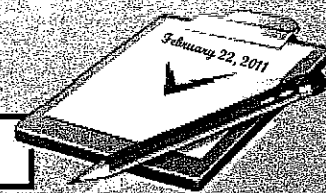

Evitando la Ejecución Hipotecaria



Si usted está teniendo problemas en pagar su casa, comience a tomar cargo de la situación informándose detalladamente sobre su hipoteca, sus finanzas y sus recursos. Comience con esta lista para tener control de lo que ya ha hecho y lo que todavía le resta por hacer. Al seguir esta, tendrá una mayor posibilidad de continuar siendo dueño de su casa.

- ◆ Contacte a su banco prestamista si tiene problemas en hacer pagos de la casa. El prestamista es la compañía a la cual usted le manda los pagos cada mes. Números de teléfonos y otros medios de contacto se pueden encontrar en los documentos o en el sitio web. Una compañía legítima de consejería de crédito puede ayudarle a encontrar el contacto apropiado.
- ◆ Averigüe si usted califica para un refinanciamiento de su préstamo. Llame a la línea gratis de consejería 888-995-HOPE (o 888-995-4673) o a alguna otra agencia de buena reputación.
- ◆ Abra toda la correspondencia que le manda su prestamista. Evitar el asunto únicamente hará que la situación se empeore.
- ◆ Reúna copias de los documentos de su hipoteca original, su verificación actual de salario, y la correspondencia sobre pagos tardíos y posible ejecución hipotecaria. Necesitará estos documentos cuando hable con su banco o con los consejeros de crédito.
- ◆ Si su prestamista ha pasado por bancarrota o está cerrando su negocio, llame a la compañía a la cual hace sus pagos para saber quién tomará cargo de su préstamo. Obtenga toda la información necesaria para poder hacer, en adelante, los pagos al nuevo prestamista.
- ◆ Consulte a un abogado si usted cree haber sido víctima de un prestamista usurero. Algunas universidades locales ofrecen clínicas legales gratuitas que le pueden proporcionar asistencia o también puede contactar al Abogado General del Estado, la Asociación Americana de Reguladores de Hipotecas Residenciales (www.aarmr.org), agencias de igualdad de vivienda, o la Comisión Federal de Comercio (www.ftc.gov).
- ◆ Pregunte a sus acreedores si el alivio que espera afectará su situación crediticia y su puntaje de crédito en una manera negativa. Si esto pasara, pregunte por una alternativa que no afectará negativamente su record de crédito.
