Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund	\$1,500	The Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarships to students of Prince George's County and conducting the Project Enrich Program.
Circle of Rights, Inc.	\$500	Circle of Rights will use grant funds for expenses related to teaching Women, Infants and Children (WIC) recipients to prepare nutritious meals to minimize their family's risk of stroke.
City of Seat Pleasant- Home and Health Monitoring Project	\$5,000	The City of Seat Pleasant will use grant funds for expenses related to providing home and health monitoring sensors to seniors residing in Seat Pleasant who wish to continue living independently and age in place. Funding will support the installation, purchase and configuration of sensors as well as pilot program management, oversight and research.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$5,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds for expenses related to working with students so that they acquire awareness of the structure and future trends within high skill, high wage public professions to increase their career options.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds for expenses related to providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the county.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$2,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for general operating expenses and for responding to the high rates of foreclosure and domestic violence in Prince George's County communities.
Cornerstone New Life Ministries	\$1,883	Cornerstone New Life Ministries will use grant funds for expenses related to expanding its Healthy Lifestyle Sunday Program - Health Sound BiteTM for Sustainable Living. This is a 75-minute program includes a brief talk led by a public health professional, low impact aerobic exercises led by a certified instructor, health food samples prepared and served by a chef and educational materials for adults and children.
Derek Anthony Moore Charity	\$1,000	Derek Anthony Moore Charity will use grant funds for supporting core programmatic direct and indirect expenses. More specifically, funds will be used for administrative staff, insurance, consulting and professional fees, home-buying workshops / financial literacy events, Kids to Kamp / Community Family Fun Day, Family Domestic Violence Program, supplies and rental space.
Eleanor Roosevelt High School	\$700	PTA Maryland Congress of Parents / Eleanor Roosevelt High School PTSA will use grant funds for expenses related to providing a memorable and safe event in which to have fun in an alcohol-free, smoke-free, drug-free and weapon-free environment to celebrate their graduation.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$1,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the outcome-driven Pathways to Career Success Program, which focuses on on-time graduation, college and workforce / career readiness.
Engaged Community Offshoots	\$1,500	Engaged Community Offshoots will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting staff in educating the community on the benefits of producing healthy food in Prince George's County. More specifically, funds will be used to implement the new 2018-2019 environmental education program called, "Growing Environmental Stewards Through Urban Farming."
Family Restoration and Healing Center	\$1,000	Family Restoration and Healing Center will use grant funds for expenses related to providing services that support job readiness, mental health and positive youth development for 130 individuals. Funds will also be used for services that support individuals with job placement, certifications, and college entry.

First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting its Homework Club, Great Minds & Great Future Academy, College Access and College Retention programs for Prince George's County students in low- to moderate income families.
Hilcrest Marlow Heights Civic Association - Dollars for Scholars	\$10,000	Hilcrest - Marlow Heights Civic Association - Dollars for Scholars will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors, continuing college students and providing achievement awards to middle school students in the local communities of Hillcrest - Marlow Heights, Maryland.
Hope Connections for Cancer	\$750	Hope Connections for Cancer Support will use grant funds for expenses related to supplementing its current programming in Prince George's County with additional Gentle Yoga and Pink Ribbon Pilates classes, as well as providing an interactive nutrition workshop.
Housing Initiative Partnership	\$1,000	Housing Initiative Partnership will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting HIP's Rapid Rehousing Program which provides intensive counseling, education and support to families transitioning out of a shelter.
Maryland 49ers, Inc. (no website)	\$2,000	Maryland 49ers will use grant funds to assist the organization in improving the quality of life, health, and group interaction skills of at-risk youth through sports and cheerleading activities. More specifically, grant funds will be used for transportation expenses, supplies, league registration fees and uniforms.

Sustainable Community Initiatives	\$500	Sustainable Community Initiatives, dba Community Forklift, will use grant funds for expenses related to increasing donorship to its Home Essentials Program to distribute free building materials, appliances and furniture to low-income residents of Councilmanic District 7. Funds will also be used to increase enrollments into the program.
The Denney House, Inc.	\$2,000	The Denney House will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the TDH Works Program. The program is designed to develop youth, ages 16-24, with core competencies related to career, college and financial literacy.
The Training Source, Inc.	\$5,000	The Training Source will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting workforce development, youth leadership and job readiness training programs, and community-based social supportive services for residents of Prince George's County.
Unshackled Ministries, Inc.	\$2,000	Unshackled Ministries will use grant funds to support its new Helping Women program which helps women returning from jail and prison re-acclimate into society and their families. The intensive six month program will focus on mental health counseling, job readiness, parenting skills, and life skills.
Women Empowered to Achieve the Impossible	\$1,000	Women Empowered To Achieve The Impossible, Inc. (WETATI) will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting its entrepreneurship education training (E-STEM) and its economic business development and sustainability activities.
