Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
100 Black Men of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	100 Black Men of Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the mentoring programs and operations conducted by them. More specifically, these programs are mentoring, education, health and wellness, and economic empowerment.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$1,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting annual scholarships to eligible Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to eligible families in need of assistance that live in the county.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc. - Pathways to Career Success	\$2,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds for expenses related to the Pathways to Career Success Program which focuses on on-time graduation, college and workforce / career readiness. The program targets students at Bladensburg High School.
Greenbelt Archive Project	\$6,250	Greenbelt Archive Project will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the digital and physical preservation of the Greenbelt News Review and its predecessor, the Greenbelt Cooperator. More specifically, funds will pay the hourly costs for expert services provided by the University of Maryland (student and faculty consultant / advisor) to ensure the overall standard of the archive.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$2,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support will use grant funds for expenses related to helping cover the costs of additional programming that provides interactive, hands-on training in nutrition and mind / body activities that help people remain strong through their cancer.
M V P Incorporated (Men of Valor and Purpose)	\$10,000	M V P Incorporated (Men of Valor and Purpose) will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting the Sport STEM Camp 2019 for Prince George's County elementary school students. This camp incorporates structured physical activities with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) to influence the overall academic performance of the students.
Parent Booster USA dba Clippers Gridiron Booster Club (no website)	\$1,500	Boosters USA dba Clippers Gridiron Booster Club will use grant funds for travel expenses associated with transporting players and coaches to and from Penn State University.
The Ayana J. McAllister Legacy Foundation, Inc.	\$2,500	The Ayana J. McAllister Legacy Foundation will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting its Annual Hoops Against Gun Violence Basketball Game. Funds will be used to purchase reusable uniforms for four teams, trophies for the winning teams, prizes for participants, souvenirs for the players, door prizes, as well as paying for a disk jockey, master of ceremonies and four referees for the games.
The Better Family, Inc.	\$5,000	The Better Family will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the Tots to Teens Expo, a community-based, free admission program held within Prince George's County.
The Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund, Inc. (CDMSF)	\$10,000	The Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarships to eligible Prince George's County high school graduates going to college and for conducting Project Enrich, a program to increase and expand scholarship opportunities by enhancing and upgrading facilities, technology and related scholastic activities for enrichment.
Unshackled Ministries	\$5,000	Unshackled Ministries will use grant funds for expenses related to funding its new women's program to help women released from jail and prison. More specifically, the funds are for the Helping Women Program to implement a one-stop center approach to the varied problems returning citizens face to reduce recidivism.
Women Empowered To Achieve The Impossible , Inc. (WETATI)	\$7,083	Women Empowered To Achieve The Impossible will use grant funds for expenses related to conducting the Entrepreneurship Education Training, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (E-STEM) education training and the Economic Business Development and Sustainability program.
