<a href="#">Bold Beautiful Brilliant Girls Youth Empowerment Group</a>	\$2,500	Bold Beautiful Brilliant Girls Youth Empowerment Group will use grants funds for rent, technology, journals, transportation and a part time administrator assistant.
<a href="#">Bold Beautiful Brilliant Girls Youth Empowerment Group</a>	\$15,300	Bold Beautiful Brilliant Girls Youth Empowerment Group will use grant funds not only to provide mentoring services through various programs which include scholarships, but during COVID-19 they will provide school supplies for students who are at home and provide on line support for students as they work to understand and complete school assignments.
<a href="#">Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.</a>	\$4,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds to implement a 10-week Driver's Education Program into the High Schools and other non-profit organizations. Offer Public Safety Educational and Informational Tours to the Prince George's County Public Safety Agencies.
<a href="#">Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men</a>	\$2,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support their two major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince Georg's County high school seniors and provide food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
<a href="#">Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., (CLS)</a>	\$2,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for general operating expenses. The funds will provide additional support to current programs and provide additional assistance to residents of Prince George's county.
<a href="#">Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$5,850	Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Prince George's County will use grant funds to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of 210 foster youth who age out at 21, at least 75% will be stably housed and at least 70% will be employed or enrolled in an educational program leading to employment.
<a href="#">Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)/Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$2,850	Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)/Prince George's County will use grant funds to purchase gift cards from restaurants in District 9 to be distributed to Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteers who support children and youth in foster care due to abuse and have pivoted their efforts to respond to the COVID-19 crisis to continue to protect best interests despite quarantine.
<a href="#">Delta Research and Education Foundation (DREF)</a>	\$10,000	Delta Research and Education Foundation will use grant funds for a Voter Registration Education Awareness Campaign and Youth Summit.
<a href="#">Employ Prince George's Inc.</a>	\$10,000	Employ Prince George's will use grant funds for their Prince George's County COVID-19 Hourly Employee Relief Fund. Their Prince COVID.19 Hourly Employee Relief Fund provides \$200 visa gift cards to Prince George's County residents who have been laid off due to the Corona virus.
<a href="#">Food &amp; Friends, Inc.</a>	\$2,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
<a href="#">NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.</a>	\$4,000	NAMI Prince George's County, MD will use grants funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy and community outreach programs for county residents.
<a href="#">New Horizons Supported Services, Inc.</a>	\$2,500	New Horizons Supported Services will use grant funds to teach adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities how to ride public transportation (bus and rail) independently and with assistance. This process is called travel training and it increases disabled adults access to community life.
<a href="#">Police District V Citizens Advisory Council (no website)</a>	\$4,500	Police District V Citizens Advisory Council will use grant funds for their Community Outreach and efforts to foster a strong community/police partnership.
<a href="#">Prince George's County Fire &amp; EMS Foundation, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Prince George's County Fire & EMS Foundation will use grant funds to provide Emergency Preparedness, Education and Assistance awareness and support to the communities of Prince George's County.

(Triad, Explorers &amp; PAL) (no website)</a>	\$13,000	Prince George's County Police T.E.P. will use grant funds to fund the Prince George's County Police Explorer Program. Funds will go to Yearly Re-Charter, uniforms, travel expenses, Explorer and Advisor training, and community service opportunities.
<a href="#">Prince George's Police T.E.P. (no website)</a>	\$3,000	Prince George's Police T.E.P. will use grant funds to provide relief for families affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.
<a href="#">Purposeful Living &amp; Giving</a>	\$5,000	Purposeful Living & Giving will use grant funds for (20) laptops for students in D9 and an Initiative at Bradford Oaks Senior Living.
<a href="#">River Jordan Project, Inc.</a>	\$6,000	River Jordan Project will use grant funds to procure emergency food and related packaging and distribution supplies for the food insecure Seniors, Adults, Children and Families, and emergency assistance to the uninsured and under-insured individuals with chronic diseases, cancer, or other illnesses impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic.
