| Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA) | \$5,000 | Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts will use grant funds to support and fund the countywide "The Performance Series", which embraces various elements the performing arts to include a special program in District 8 called "One Voice: Music and The Black Vote Concert" on Sunday, February 23, 2020 at Harmony Hall Regional Center, 10701 Livingston Road, Fort Washington, MD 20744. |
| Coalition for Concerned Black Christian Men | \$5,000 | Coalition for Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to provide gloves and masks to the six senior citizen facilities for their tenants located in District 8. The gloves and masks would also be distributed to First Responders, Hospital Staff and Weekly Food Distribution volunteers. |
| Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men | \$2,500 | Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support their two major programs that provide scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County. |
| NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. | \$5,000 | NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds to support the planning, implementation, and management of current and new programming that provide mental health education, support, advocacy and community outreach programs for county residents. |
| Prince George's Child Resource Center, Inc. | \$5,000 | Prince George's Child Resource Center will use grant funds for a comprehensive, two-generation family support services; home visiting early intervention for families at risk to neglect or abuse their children; provide technical assistance and professional development for early child care providers. |
| Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program, Inc. (no website) | \$3,000 | Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program will use grant funds for expenses related to provide Christmas food baskets to as many underprivileged families in Prince George's County as possible and to provide relief on a case-by-case basis to families or persons in the County in emergency situations. |
| Project Bright Future Mentoring, Inc. | \$10,750 | Project Bright Future Mentoring will use grant funds to improve their program by providing some of the following materials which align with the goals of Prince George's County: Reusable grocery bags to replace plastic bags and help brand their produce distribution in order to ensure that their senior clients remember to participate in the activity; Purchase (additional) portable tables for events and services; Honorariums for Guest Speakers to promote environmental awareness; Increase the amount of emergency assistance provided to the community in form of help with pampers, milk, food & formula from 15 to a goal of 75. |
| River Jordan Project, Inc. | \$10,000 | River Jordan Project will use grant funds to procure emergency food and related packaging and distribution supplies for the food insecure Seniors, Adults, Children and Families, and emergency assistance to the uninsured and under-insured individuals with chronic diseases, cancer, or other illnesses impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic. |
| River Jordan Project, Incorporated | \$5,000 | The River Jordan Project will use grant funds to increase their food capacity to meet the growing demand for food in Prince George's County. Grant funds will support River Jordan Project's five food distribution programs: Produce and Groceries to Seniors, Produce to the Community, SHARE Food Network Complimentary Groceries, Scheduled Pantry Distributions and Emergency Pantry Distribution. |
| The One World Center for Autism, Inc. | \$10,000 | The One World Center for Autism will use grant funds to continue and expand our current healthcare, individual and family support services for those living with autism in Prince George's County as a result of a significant and unanticipated discontinuation of funding in 2019. |
| Washington National's Dream Foundation | \$18,750 | Washington National's Dream Foundation will use grant funds to support Nationals Philanthropies' partnership with World Central Kitchen to prepare meals in Nationals Park and distribute the meals in the underserved neighborhoods. |
| World Central Kitchen | \$20,000 | World Central Kitchen will use grant funds to provide meals to those in need in Prince George's County, including Council District 8. |
