Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
Art Works Studio School, Inc.	\$2,000	A Wider Circle will use grant funds for expenses related to providing furnishings and basic need items for the homes of Prince George's County's most vulnerable residents.
Arc Of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$3,000	Arc of Prince George's will use grant funds to support programming that promotes community inclusion and independent living for individuals with I/DD' by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work/volunteer skills.
CASA de Maryland, Inc.	\$5,000	CASA de Maryland will use grant funds to support our Solidarity Fund which provides cash benefits to residents excluded from federal stimulus relief and our Food Access Program which provides households with weekly grocery deliveries and employs workers from our centers to sort and pack.
Cheverly Village, Inc.	\$2,500	Cheverly Village will use funds to expand their programs and services, continue subsidizing membership fees for low income residents, enable Cheverly Village to hire part-time administrative staff in the near future, and promote the village movement in Prince George's County.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$3,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in School will use grant funds to implement a 10-week Driver's Education Program into the High Schools and other non-profit organizations. Offer Public Safety Educational and Informational Tours to the Prince George's County Public Safety Agencies.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the county.
Community Forklift	\$5,000	Community Forklift will use grant funds to develop and implement a targeted donor campaign to increase the donation of appliances for the HELP program. The HELP program distributes appliances to low-income residents who need essential appliances such as refrigerators, stoves, and AC units.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., (CLS)	\$2,000	Community Legal Services will use grant funds for general operating expenses. The funds will provide additional support to current programs and provide additional assistance to residents of Prince George's county.
Ecolatinos, Inc COVID-19	\$5,000	EcoLatinos will use grant funds for their program that will provide COVID-19 prevention practices and public engagement in clean water activities among Hispanic resident of Prince George's County while providing a COVID-19 informational and educational campaign and community environmental events.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to support the 2020 Port Towns Youth Council & Pathways to Career Success Program (PTCS) Graduation Scholarship Banquet, which honors the academic achievements and college/career readiness of graduating seniors who completed the program.
Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc. (dba ECO City Farms)	\$10,040	ECO City Farms will use grant funds to continue to distribute 60 CSA shares to our members and to distribute an additional 40 CSA shares to the low- to mid-income seniors at the Emerson House in Bladensburg, feeding approximately 250 people weekly.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$2,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for general operating support during FY20 to help support FGCB's three programs: Homework Club, College Success, and Great Minds Great Futures.
Food & Friends	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$2,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support will use grant funds to improve mental health and outcomes for people with cancer in Prince George's County by providing interactive nutrition education programs and a Wellness Day to help reduce stress and educate participants on the importance of nutrition during cancer.
Latin American Youth Center	\$5,000	Latin American Youth Center will use grant funds to support purchase of bulk and culturally appropriate food for youth and families in District 5 who have been negatively impacted by COVID-19.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$3,000	Liberty's Promise will use grant funds to support after-school programs of civic engagement, held at Bladensburg High School, twice annually (October-December and March-May) in 10-week sessions.

NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$3,500	NAMI Prince George's County, MD will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy and community outreach programs for County residents
Neighborhood Design Center, Inc.	\$1,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds to supplement their community-based design services beyond that supported by their CDBG - CDW funds.
Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council, Inc	\$1,500	Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council will use grant funds for their Prince George's County Arts Community Emergency Relief Fund, which will help meet the basic needs of nonprofit arts organizations, arts businesses and individual artist.
Prince George's Child Resource Center, Inc.	\$5,000	Prince George's Child Resource Center will use grant funds for a comprehensive, two-generation family support services; home visiting early intervention for families at risk to neglect or abuse their children; provide technical assistance and professional development for early child care providers.
<u>Sisters4Sisters</u>	\$5,000	Sisters4Sisters will use grant funds to empower women, girls and families with direct resources including fresh produce, groceries, baby, free virtual empowerment workshops, an empowerment website with resources and personal protective products for those in need.
Solutions in Hometown Connections, Corp	\$4,000	Solutions is Hometown Connections will use grant funds for the position of the Early Childhood Special a critical position within the English Language Learning Program.
St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth & Families	\$1,000	St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth & Families will use grant funds to support the salaries of direct care staff of the Transitional Housing Program for homeless women with young children who provide daily supervision and guidance to residents.
Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program, Inc.	\$1,000	Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program will use grant funds to facilitate a youth Leadership Development and Life Skills Mastery Program at G James Gholson Middle School during the 2019/2020 PGCPS Academic year.
United Communities Against Poverty (UCAP)	\$11,500	United Communities Against Poverty will use grant funds to provide COVJD-19 relief assistance to our community. This funding will specifically support our efforts to replenish our emergency food pantry, purchase PPE supplies for our emergency shelter staff, essential supplies for the shelter and to pay our food venders for shelter meals.
