Bishop McNamara High School, Inc.	\$5,000	As the international health crisis has now become a financial crisis for our country, many families in the Bishop McNaman community began reaching out to the school for financial assistance and relief due to job loss, reduction of work hours, or the temporary closing of their businesses. Bishop McNamara High School will use grant funds to specifically assist those students and families who are residents of Prince George's County.
Capital Area Food Bank	\$5,000	Capital Area Food Bank will use grant funds to support their work in Prince George's County, to provide nutritious meals to County residents in need through our direct distributions programs. Funds will support staffing of our distribution programs in the County.
Charles Drew Memorial	\$10,000	The Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarships to eligible Prince George's County high school graduates going to college and for conducting Project Enrich Program.
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$2,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts will use grant funds to support programming costs related to The Performance Series in support of Black classical and opera singers.
Coalition for Concerned Black Christian Men	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to provide financial assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID19 to help supplement their rent, food, utilities and medicines. Also to provide gloves and masks to Senior Citizen Facilities, First Responders, Hospital Staff and volunteers working at Food Distribution centers.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to provide two major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and to provide food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
Community Advocates for Family & Youth	\$2,000	Community Advocates for Family & Youth will use grant funds to help County and District 6 residents who are victims of crime needing emergency safe haven assistance to get them out of harms way to be able to help plan transitional and long term housing.

Funds will provide additional support to current programs and provide additional assistance to residents of Prince George's County.

Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$1,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support will use grant funds to improve mental health and outcomes for people with cancer in Prince George's County by providing inter active nutrition education programs and a Wellness Day to help reduce stress and educate participants on the importance of nutrition during cancer.

Human Services Coalition of PG Co dba Nonprofit Prince George's Co.	\$1,500	Human Services Coalition of PG County will use grant funds for the Capacity Building Services for the County's nonprofit sector, providing information and educational trainings, advocacy, networking and collaboration opportunities.
Ivy Communities Charities of Prince George's county	\$3,000	Ivy Communities Charities of Prince George's County will use grant funds to assist them in supporting college bound students with college scholarships.
Maryland 49ers, Inc. (no website)	\$2,000	Maryland 49ers will use grant funds to assist the organization in improving the quality of life, health, and group interaction skills of at-risk youth through sports and cheerleading activities. More specifically, grant funds will be used for transportation expenses, supplies, league registration fees and uniforms.
Maryland State Tigers Youth Development, Inc.	\$2,500	Maryland State Tigers Youth Development will use grant funds to provide grant-in-aid for participation in after school programing and activities that will strengthen the social, physical and emotional health of young student athletes. New Horizons Supported Services, Inc.	\$1,000	New Horizons Supported Services will use funds to teach adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities how to ride public transportation (bus and rail) independently and with assistance. This process is called travel training and it increases disabled adults access to community life.
PG Cultural Arts Foundation, Inc.	\$4,000	PG Cultural Arts Foundation will use grant funds to provide scholarships to Prince George's County high school and college students pursuing higher education in the arts. Scholarships will be awarded during the Lake Arbor jazz Festival in July 2020.
Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council, Inc	\$4,000	Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council will use grant funds for their Prince George's County Arts Community Emergency Relief Fund.
Prince George's County Fire & EMS Foundation, Inc.	\$4,000	Prince George's County Fire & EMS Foundation will use the grant funds to provide Emergency Preparedness, Education and Assistance awareness and support to the communities of Prince George's County.
Prince George's County Police Athletic League, Inc.	\$2,000	Prince George's County Police Athletic League will use grant funds to expand current programs and implement new youth development programs in 2020.
Prince George's County Police T.E.P. (Triad, Explorers & PAL) (no website)	\$3,000	Prince George's County Police T.E.P. will use grant funds for their Prince George's County Police Explorer Program. Funds will go to Yearly Re-Charter, uniforms, travel expenses, Explorer and Advisor training, and community service opportunities.
Prince George's County Public Assistance Program, Inc. (no website)	\$3,000	Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program will use grant funds for expenses related to provide Christmas food baskets to as many underprivileged families in Prince George's County as possible and to provide relief on a case-by-case basis to families or persons in the County in emergency situations.
Prince George's Tennis & Education Foundation	\$2,000	Prince George's Tennis & Education Foundation will use grant funds to support the academic, athletic and civic development of county youths using tennis instruction, training and clinics as the tool.
SEAC, Inc.	\$2,500	SEAC will use grant funds to support stipends to college students working in SEAC, Inc.'s #MAP (Math Achievers Program). #MAP is a 6-week summer math instruction and enrichment program for Prince George's County middle school students and their parents.
Shabach Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	Shabach Ministries will use funds for food and personal care items to distribute to those who are disadvantaged and disenfranchised due to COVID-19. Shabach Ministries, Inc. has already distributed food to over 2,000 families since 3/19/20 and will be mass producing bags of groceries for distribution.
St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth & Families	\$1,000	St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth & Families will use grant funds to support the salaries of direct care staff of the Transitional Housing Program for homeless women with young children who provide daily supervision and guidance to residents.
The District Heights Youth Development Foundation, Inc.	\$8,000	The District Heights Youth Development Foundation will use grant funds to support, coordinate and implement events that supports youth and families in Districts 6, 7 and 8. This support includes providing food, a yearly health fair, and SK run/walk.

<u>The Foundation Schools</u>	\$2,000	The Foundation Schools will use grant funds to purchase two sensory paths which will provide evidence-based sensory support intervention to our students with autism and decrease behavioral outbursts and improve their academic and social-emotional functioning.
<u>Women Empowered to Achieve The Impossible (WETATi), Inc.</u>	\$1,500	Women Empowered to Achieve The Impossible will use grant funds to provide entrepreneurship education, equip and empower the next generation to create and promote their own opportunities and find financial freedom through workforce development programs and idea competitions.
<u>Youth Professional Development, Inc.</u>	\$1,500	Youth Professional Development will use grant funds for providing life skills and job readiness training and support services for disadvantaged teens in Prince George's County.
