Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
A Wider Circle, Inc.	\$2,000	A Wider Circle will use grant funds for expenses related to providing furnishings and basic need items for the homes of Prince George's County's most vulnerable residents.
Arc Of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$1,500	Arc Of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support programming that promotes community inclusion and independent living for individuals with I/DD by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work/volunteer skills.
Art Works Studio School, Inc.	\$5,000	Art Works Studio School will use grant funds to provide visual arts classes designed specifically for older adults in District 2 through a partnership with the MNCPPC and Art Works Now.
Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist	\$30,000	Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist will use grant funds to provide emergency rental assistance to residents of Prince Georges County District 2 who have been adversely affected by COVID-19.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., (CLS)	\$2,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for general operating expenses. The funds will provide additional support to current programs and provide additional assistance to residents of Prince George's County.
Community Youth Advance	\$1,500	Community Youth Advance will use grant funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
Court Appointed Special Advocate/Prince George's County, Inc. (CASA)	\$5,000	Court Appointed Special Advocate/Prince George's County will use grant funds to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of 200 foster youth who age out at 21, at least 75% will be stably housed and at least 70% will be employed or enrolled in an educational program leading to employment.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for general operating support during FY20 to help support FGCB's three programs: Homework Club, College Success, and Great Minds Great Futures.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$1,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$660	Food & Friends will use grant funds to deliver - using a "no contact" delivery process - fifty (50) emergency food boxes to residents of Prince George's County, residing in District 2.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$1,000	Liberty's Promise will us grant funds to support after-school programs of civic engagement, held at Northwestern High School, twice annually (October-December and March-May) in 10-week sessions.
Neighborhood Design Center, Inc.	\$2,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds to supplement their community-based design services beyond that supported by their CDBG - CDW funds.
Northern Gateway CDC	\$22,000	Northern Gateway CDC will use grant funds for staff and support for Census 2020 outreach, general CDC functions, including consultants, professional services, and administrative tools and software, to implement County/State/other grants and small business and community outreach initiatives.
Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council, Inc	\$2,000	Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council will use grant funds for their Prince George's County Arts Community Emergency Relief Fund.

Prince George's Child Resource Center, Inc.	\$1,800	Prince George's Child Resource Center has witnessed the rise of food insecurity among the families they serve and will utilize the grant funds through their weekly food distribution site at Cool Spring Elementary. In order to ensure the safety of staff and volunteers during this weekly event, Prince George's Child Resource Center will use grant funds to purchase needed personal protection equipment (PPE) and sanitizing products.
Prince George's County Police Athletic League, Inc.	\$15,000	Prince George's County Police Athletic League will use grant funds to expand current programs and implement new youth development programs in 2020.
St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth & Families	\$1,000	St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth & Families will use grant funds to support the salaries of direct care staff of the Transitional Housing Program for homeless women with young children who provide daily supervision and guidance to residents.
Town of Brentwood	\$1,540	The Town of Brentwood will use grant funds to support all annual events hosted by the Town.
