Arc Of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$2,500	Arc Of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support programming that promotes community inclusion and independent living for individuals with LIDO by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work/volunteer skills.
Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare (Bowie CLAW)	\$3,500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare will use grant funds to provide for Bowie' CLAW's pet food pantry which enables people in need to keep and provide adequately for their pets. Moreover, grant funds will be used to support our Community Cat Initiative which, through "trap/neuter/return," is reducing the feral cat population in and around Bowie

City of Greenbelt - Youth Services Bureau	\$2,000	City of Greenbelt - Youth Services Bureau will use grants funds for their Greenbelt CARES that will be provide mental health counseling to youth and their families, GED preparations courses and tutoring services.
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$3,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts will use grant funds to support their countywide "The Performance Series" program, which embraces various elements the performing arts to include a special District #4 Senior Citizen's Luncheon in June 2020.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support their two major programs that provide scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
Community Forklift	\$2,500	Community Forklift will use grant funds to develop and implement a targeted donor campaign to increase the donation of appliances for the HELP program. The HELP program distributes appliances to low-income residents who need essential appliances such as refrigerators, stoves, and AC units.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc., (CLS)	\$2,500	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds for general operating expenses. The funds will provide additional support to current programs and provide additional assistance to residents of Prince George's County.
Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Prince George's County, Inc.	\$2,000	Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to advocate for the physical health, mental health, safe housing, educational and social needs of 200 foster youth. At the age of 21, at least 75% will be stably housed and at least 70% will be employed or enrolled in an educational program leading to employment.

DAMCI's Kids to Kamp program provides funding for recreational, educational, and enrichment camp opportunities.

Prince George's County Police Athletic League	\$2,500	Prince George's County Police Athletic League will use grants funds to provide the equipment and supplies for their programs, and to cover operational costs and insurance costs.
Prince George's County Police T.E.P (Triad, Explorers & PAL) (no website)	\$2,500	Prince George's County Police T.E.P. will use grant funds for expenses related to their Prince George's County Police Explorer Program. Expenses include the yearly Re-Charter, travel expenses, uniforms, Explorer and Advisor training, and community service opportunities.
Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program (no website)	\$2,000	Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program will use grant funds for expenses related to providing Christmas food baskets to as many underprivileged families in Prince George's County as possible and providing relief on a case-by-case basis to families or persons in the County in emergency situations.
Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc.	\$2,500	Prince George's Philharmonic will use grant funds to support the educational outreach programs the Philharmonic has with the Prince George's County Public Schools and the increased production costs of the Philharmonic for the concerts it performs during the 2019-2020 season.
Prince George's Tennis & Education Foundation	\$2,500	Prince George's Tennis & Education Foundation will use grant funds to support the academic, athletic and civic development of county youths using tennis instruction, training and clinics as the tool.
