Organization Name	Amount	Grant Purpose
Art Works Studio School, Inc.	\$1,500	Art Works Studio School will use grant funds for expenses related to providing visual art classes designed specifically for older adults in Council District 7 through a partnership with the M-NCPPC and Art Works Now.
Arc Of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$2,500	Arc Of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support programming that promotes community inclusion and independent living for individuals by preparing them for post-secondary education and employment, and delivering activities that build work/volunteer skills.
Berean Baptist Church of Prince George's County, Maryland (BBC)	\$1,200	Berean Baptist Church of Prince George's will use grant funds to provide a gift to 120 family caregivers in the County. The Berean Baptist Church has identified family caregivers through Senior Centers and Home Health Aid Companies.
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$5,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts will use grant funds to support their countywide "The Performance Series" program, which embraces various elements the performing arts to include a special District #4 Senior Citizen's Luncheon in June 2020.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$5,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds for expenses related to implementing a 10-week Driver's Education Program into the high schools and other non-profit organizations and offering public safety educational and informational tours to the Prince George's County public safety agencies.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support their two major programs that provide scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and food and monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
Daughter For The Day	\$2,500	Daughter For The Day will use grant funds for education seminars to prolong the onset of dementia and nutritional food samples (wild salmon, asparagus,) as well as delivering fresh produce to low-income seniors in District 7.
Delta Foundation, Inc.	\$1,500	Delta Foundation will use grant funds to partner with community organizations and domestic violence professionals to host a summit to address the impact of domestic violence on children in Prince George's County.
Ecolatinos, Inc. - COVID-19	\$1,625	EcoLatinos will use grant funds for their program that will provide COVID-19 prevention practices and public engagement in clean water activities among Hispanic resident of Prince George's County while providing a COVID-19 informational and educational campaign and community environmental events.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$2,500	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to support the 2020 Port Towns Youth Council & Pathways to Career Success Program (PTCS) Graduation Scholarship Banquet, which honors the academic achievements and college/career readiness of graduating seniors who completed the program.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for general operating support during FY20 to help support FGCB's three programs: Homework Club, College Success, and Great Minds Great Futures.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc. (no website)	\$1,500	Jacob's Ladder will use grant funds for expenses related to assisting these ongoing programs: Juvenile Diversion, Cheltenham Youth Detention Center, Junior Workforce Academy and Teen Dating.
Maryland 49ers, Inc. (no website)	\$4,000	Maryland 49ers will use grant funds to assist the organization in improving the quality of life, health, and group interaction skills of at-risk youth through sports and cheerleading activities. More specifically, grant funds will be used for transportation expenses, supplies, league registration fees and uniforms.
Mentoring Through Athletics, Inc.	\$3,500	Mentoring Through Athletics will use grant funds for expenses related to providing mentoring services as well as meals to engage the families at the Suitland Elementary School, William Beanes Elementary School, Seat Pleasant Elementary School and Francis Scott Key Elementary School. More specifically, funds will be used for mentor stipends, academic resource materials, emergency food, family engagement and healthy snacks.

NAMI Prince George's County MD, Inc.	\$2,000	NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds to support the planning, implementation, and management of current and new programming that provide mental health education, support, advocacy and community outreach programs for county residents.
Neighborhood Design Center, Inc.	\$5,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds for expenses related to supplementing its community-based design services. More specifically, funds will be used for covering funding gaps that exist due to the specific requirements of its current grant and contract funding.
Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council, Inc	\$2,000	Prince George's Arts & Humanities Council will use grant funds for their Prince George's County Arts Community Emergency Relief Fund.
Prince George's Child Resource Center, Inc.	\$2,000	Prince George's Child Resource Center will use grant funds for a comprehensive, two-generation family support services; home visiting early intervention for families at risk to neglect or abuse their children; provide technical assistance and professional development for early child care providers.
Prince George's County Police Athletic League, Inc.	\$3,000	Prince George's County Police Athletic League will use grants funds to provide the equipment and supplies for their programs, and to cover operational costs and insurance costs.
Prince George's County Police T.E.P. (Triad, Explorers & PAL) (no website)	\$5,000	Prince George's County Police T.E.P. will use grant funds for expenses related to their Prince George's County Police Explorer Program. Expenses include the yearly Re-Charter, travel expenses, uniforms, Explorer and Advisor training, and community service opportunities.
Prince George's County Public Assistance Program, Inc. (no website)	\$3,000	Prince George's County Public Safety Assistance Program will use grant funds for expenses related to provide Christmas food baskets to as many underprivileged families in Prince George's County as possible and to provide relief on a case-by-case basis to families or persons in the County in emergency situations.
Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc.	\$2,500	Prince George's Philharmonic will use grant funds to support the educational outreach programs the Philharmonic has with the Prince George's County Public Schools and the increased production costs of the Philharmonic for the concerts it performs during the 2019-2020 season.
Seventh Councilmanic District Constituent Fund Committee	\$8,000	Seventh Councilmanic District Constituent Fund Committee will use grant funds to assist families in need with payment of rent and utilities to prevent evictions and the shutdown of utility services. Grant funds will also aid in providing shoes and school uniforms for students in need.
St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth and Families	\$1,000	St. Ann's Center for Children, Youth and Families will use grant funds for expenses related to supporting the salaries of direct care staff of the Transitional Housing Program who provide daily supervision and guidance to homeless women with young children.
Student Athletes For Educational Opportunities, Inc. (SAFE0)	\$6,000	Student Athletes For Educational Opportunities will use grant funds to enlist Prince George's County Public School students (15-19) seeking service learning hours to serve as agents of change for the SAFE0 "Food Deserts" survey.
Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program, Inc.	\$6,175	Take Charge Juvenile Diversion Program will use grant funds for expenses related to facilitating a Leadership Development and Life Skills Mastery Program at Andrew Jackson Academy in District 7. More specifically, funds will be used for staffing, materials, equipment, training, data management and refreshments for the program for the FY20 academic year.
The One World Center for Autism, Inc.	\$2,000	The One World Center for Autism will use grant funds to continue and expand our current healthcare, individual and family support services for those living with autism in Prince George's County as a result of a significant and unanticipated discontinuation of funding in 2019.
The Training Source, Inc.	\$5,000	The Training Source will use grant funds for general operating support of adult job training; youth leadership, college and career planning; job readiness training; wrap-around support services (SNAP, clothing, etc.); and small business staffing assistance and staff training,
Women Empowered to Achieve The Impossible (WETATi), Inc.	\$2,500	Women Empowered to Achieve The Impossible will use grant funds to provide entrepreneurship education, equip and empower the next generation to create and promote their own opportunities and find financial freedom through workforce development programs and idea competitions.
World Arts Focus, Inc. dba Joe's Movement Emporium	\$5,000	Joe's Movement Emporium will use grant funds to support Joe's Creative Works program, a 7-month vocational training program for high-school seniors and recently out of school young adults providing technical training, arts-based learning in life skills, job placement and college prep.

<u>Youth Professional Development, Inc.</u>	\$1,000	Youth Professional Development will use grant funds for providing life skills and job readiness training and support services for disadvantaged teens in Prince George's County.
