Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$3,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now, will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich education through virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all age groups and abilities; and to provide free pizzas and art activities to essential workers and those experiencing food and income insecurity.
BCAUSEICAN, Inc.	\$1,500	BCAUSEICAN, Inc. will use grant funds to cover the costs of a program manager to oversee the rapid expansion of our classes in Prince George's County.
Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church	\$23,000	Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church will use grant funds to provide emergency rent, utilities, and temporary housing to those in District 2 who are facing eviction and have fallen behind in rent or mortgage payments.
B-Roll Media	\$1,000	B-Roll Media will use grant funds to help support cost-free media arts education and training for underserved youth ages 13-21 and youth with diagnosed learning disabilities in Prince George's County, Maryland. More specifically, funds will help cover the costs of salaries / wages for instructors and for equipment.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County	\$5,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to underserved parts of the county lacking access to legal services, especially with regards to housing and consumer law matters which have increased due to the pandemic, but also including other civil legal matters.
Community Youth Advance	\$2,500	Community Youth Advance will use grant funds to deliver year-round academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
First Generation College Bound	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operating expenses related to their mission of inspiring low income and first- generation youth to achieve their social and economic success by providing advice, encouragement, and support to obtain a college degree.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
Junior Achievement of Greater Washington	\$2,500	Junior Achievement of Greater Washington will use grant funds to provide comprehensive financial literacy education to every 8th grade student in PGCPS, as well as to support the inaugural year of 3DE—an innovative high school education model.
L.E.E.P to College Foundation	\$1,500	L.E.E.P will use grant funds to continue their program which provides mental support, 1-to-1 tutoring and technological support/devices.
La Clinica Del Pueblo	\$3,000	La Clinica Del Pueblo will use grant funds to meet the needs of Latino families in Prince George's County through the provision of comprehensive primary care and mental health services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate for low-income and uninsured county residents.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$3,000	Liberty's Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to support their after-school program of civic engagement, held at Parkdale High School, twice annually, either in person or virtually, in 10 week sessions.
Maryland International Corridor CDC (dba Northern Gateway)	\$25,000	Funds will help Northern Gateway Community Development Corporation maintain its capacity and continue to advocate for the Northern Gateway community through outreach and connecting the community with programs, services and resources that are available in these uncertain times.
Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care	\$5,000	Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care will use funds to continue providing crucial maternal health care to pregnant women at its Adelphi site in Prince George's County.
NAMI Prince George's County, Inc.	\$3,000	NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to providing mental health support, education, advocacy and community outreach for county residents.
Neighborhood Design Center	\$3,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds for continuity of pro bono design services during the COVID health and economic crisis.
