Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare	\$3,500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare will use grant funds to support their Community Cat Initiative which, through "trap/neuter/return" (TNR) is reducing the feral cat population in the Greater Bowie area, including Council Districts 3, 4, 5 and 6 as well as Glenn Dale, Glenridge, Landover Hills, Lanham and New Carrollton.
Champ House Recovery, Inc.	\$5,000	Champ House Recovery will use grant funds for its 3.1 certification application. The funds will be used to allow Champ House to submit appropriate documentation and applications, as well as pay related consulting fees and costs.
City of Greenbelt Advisory Committee	\$2,000	City of Greenbelt Advisory Committee will use grant funds for graduating seniors to cover college related expenses.
City of Greenbelt CARES	\$5,000	City of Greenbelt CARES will use grant funds to provide mental health counseling, GED and tutoring services to youth and their families via virtual and in person means as determined by COVID restrictions.
City of Greenbelt Eviction Relief	\$2,000	City of Greenbelt Eviction Relief will use grant funds to assist Greenbelt residents who are facing eviction from their home.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$1,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
Community Crisis Services, Inc.	\$2,500	Community Crisis Services, Inc., will use grant funds to provide one Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) training workshop and one Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training workshop to community organizations, first responders, government employees, teachers and others who wish to received the training.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County	\$2,500	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to underserved parts of the county lacking access to legal services, especially with regards to housing and consumer law matters which have increased due to the pandemic, but also including other civil legal matters.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County	\$1,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County will use grants funds to provide monthly 250 to 350 housing assistance applicants (mostly mothers with children) consultations, referral services, and small grants to help qualified Prince Georgians avoid eviction resulting from COVID-19 hardships.
Community Youth Advance	\$2,500	Community Youth Advance will grant funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges.
End Time Harvest Ministries	\$2,500	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to contract an Organization Developer for one year to help the founding Executive Director / President to administer the organization's strategic plan and to provide scholarships to 2021 graduating seniors.
Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms	\$1,500	Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms, will use grant funds to safely and securely produce local, healthy and affordable food, as well as support its capacity to feed its neighbors in this time of need and to train others to provide essential sustenance in the future.
First Generation College Bound	\$3,500	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operating expenses related to their mission of inspiring low income and first- generation youth to achieve their social and economic success by providing advice, encouragement, and support to obtain a college degree.

Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
