| AsylumWorks | \$5,000 | AsylumWorks will use grant funds to provide asylum-seeking families and unaccompanied children living in Prince George's County with immediate cash assistance to address unmet needs via their Client Emergency Fund. |
| BCAUSEICAN, Inc. | \$2,500 | BCAUSEICAN, Inc. will use grant funds to cover the costs of a program manager to oversee the rapid expansion of our classes in Prince George's County. |
| Cheverly Village | \$5,000 | Cheverly Village will use grant funds to provide Village members and others with access to low or at no cost flu shots; provide subsidized memberships to low-income members; rent space in preparation for a return to in-person programming and enhance the Village's computer resources. |
| Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. | \$5,000 | Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools will use grant funds to support the Driver's Education Scholarship Program, to provide Educational Public Safety Tours, to support its Public Safety Summer Camp, Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT) Training, and Life, Leadership and Social Skills Program. |
| Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men | \$1,000 | Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County. |
| Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc. [CAFY] | \$1,000 | Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc. [CAFY] will use grant funds to help underwrite the costs of those impacted by domestic violence and particularly those who are impacted by COVID-19 and need immediate counseling. More specifically, funds will be used for transportation assistance to court proceedings, providing in-home and virtual crisis intervention with an advocate, therapist or law enforcement, and emergency safe-haven housing. |
| Community Crisis Services, Inc. | \$5,000 | Community Crisis Services, Inc., will use grant funds to provide one Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) training workshop and one Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training workshop to community organizations, first responders, government employees, teachers and others who wish to received the training. |
| Community Forklift, Inc. | \$5,000 | Community Forklift will use grant funds for to enhance its community programming (Home Essentials and Community Building Blocks) to support local residents affected by the COVID-19 crisis. |
| Community Legal Services of Prince George's County | \$8,000 | Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to underserved parts of the county lacking access to legal services, especially with regards to housing and consumer law matters which have increased due to the pandemic, but also including other civil legal matters. |
| Community Ministry of Prince George's County | \$4,200 | Community Ministry of Prince George's County will use grants funds to provide monthly 250 to 350 housing assistance applicants (mostly mothers with children) consultations, referral services, and small grants to help qualified Prince Georgians avoid eviction resulting from COVID-19 hardships. |
| Community Youth Advance | \$1,000 | Community Youth Advance will use grant funds to deliver year-round academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to meet life's challenges. |
| Damascus House Community Development Corporation | \$2,000 | Damascus House Community Development Corporation will use grant funds for their Transitional Housing for Returning Citizens in Prince George's County: comprehensive therapeutic re-entry services and workforce development and employment. |
