Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$500	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now, will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich education through virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all age groups and abilities; and to provide free pizzas and art activities to essential workers and those experiencing food and income insecurity.
Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund (CDMSF)	\$10,000	Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarships to eligible Prince George's County High School graduates going to college and for conducting and mentoring Project Enrich Program.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County	\$2,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide mobile legal services to reach out to underserved parts of the county lacking access to legal services, especially with regards to housing and consumer law matters which have increased due to the pandemic, but also including other civil legal matters.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County	\$3,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County will use grants funds to provide monthly 250 to 350 housing assistance applicants (mostly mothers with children) consultations, referral services, and small grants to help qualified Prince Georgians avoid eviction resulting from COVID-19 hardships.
District Heights Youth Development Foundation, Inc.	\$20,000	District Height Youth Development Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to supplement the expansion of positive youth development programming and clinical staff; increase community engagement; build awareness of exercise's impact on mental health through the My Sole Knows 5K - Mind, Body & Sole campaign.
End Time Harvest Ministries	\$2,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to contract an Organization Developer for one year to help the founding Executive Director / President to administer the organization's strategic plan and to provide scholarships to 2021 graduating seniors.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$2,500	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operating expenses related to their mission of inspiring low income and first- generation youth to achieve their social and economic success by providing advice, encouragement, and support to obtain a college degree.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$10,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
Gethsemane United Methodist Church	\$3,000	Gethsemane United Methodist Church will use grant funds to support the implementation of two Farmers Markets, and food distribution programs in Healthy Food Priority Areas in Prince George's County.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$2,000	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc. will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$2,500	The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships to students who reside in or attend a school in District 9.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc.	\$3,000	Jacob's Ladder will use requested grant funds to support their ongoing programs: Diversion, Reentry, COVID Relief, Junior Workforce Academy and Media Relations Division which aim to reduce the number of juveniles entering and returning to the juvenile justice system.
Junior Achievement of Greater Washington	\$2,000	Junior Achievement of Greater Washington will use grant funds to provide comprehensive financial literacy education to every 8th grade student in PGCPS, as well as to support the inaugural year of 3DE—an innovative high school education model.

L.E.E.P to College Foundation	\$2,500	L.E.E.P to College Foundation will use grant funds to continue their program which provides mental support, 1-to-1 tutoring and technological support/devices.
