Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now	\$1,500	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now, will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich education through virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all age groups and abilities.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
Community Advocates for Family and Youth	\$2,500	Community Advocates for Family and Youth will use grant funds to help male domestic / intimate violence victims. The pandemic has caused a spike in domestic violence cases due to health in close proximity with dual roles of work and child care, and uncertainty of job stability.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County	\$2,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County will use grants funds to provide monthly 250 to 350 housing assistance applicants (mostly mothers with children) consultations, referral services, and small grants to help qualified Prince Georgians avoid eviction resulting from COVID-19 hardships.
Damascus House Community Development Corporation	\$2,810	Damascus House Community Development Corporation will use grant funds for their Transitional Housing for Returning Citizens in Prince George's County: comprehensive therapeutic re-entry services and workforce development and employment.
First Generation College Bound	\$2,500	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operating expenses related to their mission of inspiring low income and first- generation youth to achieve their social and economic success by providing advice, encouragement, and support to obtain a college degree.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide medically-tailored, home-delivered meals and groceries to individuals with serious illnesses such as HIV/AIDS and cancer that are too ill to buy or prepare food for themselves.
Gethsemane United Methodist Church	\$3,190	Gethsemane United Methodist Church will use grant funds to support the implementation of two Farmers Markets, and food distribution programs in Healthy Food Priority Areas in Prince George's County.
Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association Dollars for Scholar	\$5,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association Dollars for Scholars will use grant funds to make scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors, continuing college students, and achievement awards to middle school students in the local communities of Prince George's County, Maryland.
Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	The Ivy Community Charities will us grant funds to create and deliver visual arts careers programming for middle and high school students through a talk series, hands-on activities and a culminating 3D mapping projection exhibition focused on the impact of The Harlem Renaissance.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc.	\$1,500	Jacob's Ladder will use requested grant funds to support their ongoing programs: Diversion, Reentry, COVID Relief, Junior Workforce Academy and Media Relations Division which aim to reduce the number of juveniles entering and returning to the juvenile justice system.

NAMI Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to providing mental health support, education, advocacy and community outreach for county residents.
Neighborhood Design Center	\$5,000	Neighborhood Design Center will use grant funds for continuity of pro bono design services during the COVID health and economic crisis.
PFC Black Chamber of Commerce	\$5,000	PFC Black Chamber of Commerce will use grant funds to provide very small businesses access to short-term funds to assist in surviving the COVID-19 crisis.
