<a href="#">Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now</a>	\$3,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc., dba Art Works Now, will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich education through virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all age groups and abilities; and to provide free pizzas and art activities to essential workers and those experiencing food and income insecurity.
<a href="#">Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund (CDMSF)</a>	\$1,000	Charles Drew Memorial Scholarship Fund will use grant funds for expenses related to providing scholarships to eligible Prince George's County High School graduates going to college and for conducting and mentoring Project Enrich Program.
<a href="#">Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)</a>	\$1,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA) will use grant funds to help broaden arts education, culture awareness, arts appreciation, and audience development by reaching a diverse group of Black performers, youth, and seniors in Prince George's County.
<a href="#">Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men</a>	\$1,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men will use grant funds to support two of their major programs in providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County High school seniors and to provide food & monetary donations to families in need of assistance that live in the County.
<a href="#">Community Crisis Services, Inc.</a>	\$1,000	Community Crisis Services, Inc., will use grant funds to provide one Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) training workshop and one Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training workshop to community organizations, first responders, government employees, teachers and others who wish to receive the training.

<a href="#">Gethsemane United Methodist Church</a>	\$1,000	Gethsemane United Methodist Church will use grant funds to support the implementation of two Farmers Markets, and food distribution programs in Healthy Food Priority Areas in Prince George's County.

<a href="#">NAMI Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$500	NAMI Prince George's County will use grant funds for expenses related to providing mental health support, education, advocacy and community outreach for county residents.
<a href="#">PFC Black Chamber of Commerce</a>	\$25,000	PFC Black Chamber of Commerce will use grant funds to provide very small businesses access to short-term funds to assist in surviving the COVID-19 crisis.
