Organization Name	Amount Entered when approved only	Grant Purpose
Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council, Inc.	\$10,000	Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council will use grant funds to offset fund cuts to its signature grant program which supports artists, arts organizations and agencies throughout the County through Artist Fellowships, County Arts (organizations), Arts in Education and Public Art.
St. Matthews Housing Corp.	\$10,000	St. Matthews Housing Corp. will use grant funds for property improvements for their client's safety at both their Alpha and Beta Houses in Bowie. Improvements would consist of tree trimming, carpet replacement, kitchen counter repair, electrical repair and water proofing.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operational expenses. More specifically, funds will be used to support the College Success and Homework Club programs and related expenses.
Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc.	\$5,000	Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc. will use grant funds to support their efforts in expanding their programs, provide organizational funding needed due to a lack of fundraising, due to COVID-19. Funds will also help them to establish new partnerships in the County to expand the number of youth they can receive.
Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc.	\$5,000	Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care will use grant funds to continue providing wellness, prenatal and behavioral health services to uninsured participants amidst the pandemic at its Adelphi health clinic in Prince George's County.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to continue their ETHM's Pathway to Career Success program, which develops youth academically with a career and college preparation focus, including on-time graduation and preparation for college and workforce entry.
United Communities Against Poverty, Inc.	\$5,000	United Communities Against Poverty, Inc. will use grant funds to help support the operation of their Children's Enrichment Program.
World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium	\$5,000	World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium will use grant funds for CreativeWorks, a paid workforce development program that provides young adults ages 17 - 24 with technical theatre, digital media, life skills, and college and career preparedness training.
Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc.	\$3,500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc. will use grant funds to support their Community Cat Initiative which, through "trap/neuter/return" (TNR), is reducing the feral cat population in Bowie and County Districts 3,4,5 and 6.
Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc.	\$3,000	Anacostia Trails Heritage Area will use grant funds to make Spanish-language translation of English-only self-guided cultural / historical trail and tour maps / brochures. Funds will also be used for web publishing.
Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.	\$3,000	Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area will use grant funds to purchase food items to assist in the preparation of meals for its clients. The more than tripling of its client base, along with the need to relocate, has stretched the organization's budget. Funds will help to maintain the price of the daily client fee.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$3,000	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
Victory of Hope Outreach Ministry, Inc.	\$2,500	Victory of Hope Outreach Ministry, Inc., will use grant funds for their once a month, every third or fourth Saturday they provide Regular Value Food Packages to Families, Widows, Seniors and Veterans who are struggling to purchase these food packages from SHARE Food Network thru Catholic Charities in Washington, D.C.

Arc of Prince George's County	\$2,500	Arc of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support their programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and their Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc.	\$2,500	Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc. will use grant funds to support educational outreach efforts and rehearsal/concert venue rental fees.
The First Tee of Greater Washington	\$2,500	The First Tee of Greater Washington will use grant funds for general operations of the youth development programs in Prince George's County public schools, both in school and after school. More specifically, funds will be used primarily for the Life Skills Experience Program, but also for the First Tee School Program and the First Tee DRIVE Program: Target Outreach. The funding will allow First Tee to remove youth from the waitlist, to hire and train new coaches, and to provide transportation options from the community centers.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$2,500	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, Public Safety tours, leadership development and life skills, with the goal of higher education or workforce development and an improved quality of life.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland	\$2,500	Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland will use grant funds to provide 150-250 COVID-19 affected applicants (mostly mothers and seniors) housing assistance consisting of consultations, referral services and small grants to avoid evictions.
NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$2,500	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$2,500	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide general legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services, including its Pilot Jail program to assist inmates in the Prince George's County Detention Center and representation for survivors of domestic violence.
Friends of New Deal Café Arts, Inc.	\$2,500	Friends of New Deal Café Arts will use grant funds for expenses related to its 2022 Crazy Quilt Music Festival. Expenses include bands, sound technician, banners, advertising, food for the bands and tee shirts.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$2,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs: providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need that live in the county. Funds will also be used for CCBCM's COVID initiative. More specifically, this initiative provides supplemental assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID to help them with expenses for rent, food, utilities and medicine.
Art Works Studio School, Inc.	\$2,000	Art Works Studio School, Inc. will use grant funds to provide accessible, content-rich arts education through in-person, hybrid and virtual programmatic efforts for Prince George's County residents of all ages.
City of Greenbelt - Advisory Committee on Education (ACE)	\$2,000	City of Greenbelt - Advisory Committee on Education will use grant funds for scholarships for two eligible graduating seniors from Eleanor Roosevelt High School.
City of Greenbelt - CARES	\$2,000	City of Greenbelt - CARES will use grant funds to provide mental health counseling and GED and tutoring services to youth and their families via virtual and in-person means as determined by COVID restrictions. More specifically, funds serve an average of 75 youth and their families annually in family counseling and an average of 50 students through education programs.
Lillian's Place Company	\$1,000	Lillian's Place Company will use grant funds to provide educational, vocational and employment services to at risk youth 16-24 residing in the Prince George's County areas, as well as assisting low-income families in PG and area Districts.
City of Greenbelt - Eviction Relief	\$1,000	City of Greenbelt - Eviction Relief will use grant funds to assist Greenbelt residents who are facing eviction from their homes. More specifically, grants of up to \$500 will serve four residents.
