Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to continue their ETHM's Pathway to Career Success program, which develops youth academically with a career and college preparation focus, including on-time graduation and preparation for college and workforce entry.
First Generation College Bound, Inc.	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operational expenses. More specifically, funds will be used to support the College Success and Homework Club programs and related expenses.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$5,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, Public Safety tours, leadership development and life skills, with the goal of higher education or workforce development and an improved quality of life.
Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide general legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services, including its Pilot Jail program to assist inmates in the Prince George's County Detention Center and representation for survivors of domestic violence.
Community Forklift	\$5,000	Community Forklift will use grant funds for expenses related to its Home Essentials Program (HELP) which provides free home materials to underserved residents in District 5 of Prince George's County and beyond.
AsylumWorks	\$5,000	AsylumWorks will use grant funds to provide asylum-seeking families and unaccompanied children living in Prince George's County with immediate cash assistance to address unmet needs via our Client Emergency Fund.
ecoLatinos, Inc.	\$5,000	ecoLatinos will use grant funds for supporting volunteer outreach at Prince George's County waterways - tent, tables, flyers, water - to educate the public on water quality. Funds will also be used to help pay the project coordinator, the social media campaign designer for 10 weeks of social media outreach and to purchase plants as gifts for the volunteers.
Community Crisis Services Inc.	\$5,000	Community Crisis Services Inc. will use grant funds to provide one (1) Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) trainings and one (1) Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) trainings to up to twenty five (25) persons each for a total of 50 community members trained in suicide prevention and crisis intervention.
Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms	\$5,000	Engaged Community Offshoots, Inc., dba ECO City Farms will use grant funds for expenses related to safely and securely producing local, healthy and affordable food. These include continued support of ECO City Farms' capacity to feed its neighbors in this time of need and to train others to provide essential sustenance in the future. More specifically, funds will be used for farm staff salaries, taxes and benefits, for farm operations and for educational programming.
Lindaben Foundation	\$4,000	Lindaben Foundation will use grant funds to support its Feeding the Kids on Weekends program to serve a Title I school in District 5.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland	\$4,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland will use grant funds to provide 150-250 COVID-19 affected applicants (mostly mothers and seniors) housing assistance consisting of consultations, referral services and small grants to avoid evictions.
NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$3,500	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$3,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA) will use grant funds for its Senior Citizens Program, a multi-genre, year-round arts program for active, retired, ____ which includes music, dance, visual arts, theatre, choral singing and technology.

Vine Corps Inc.	\$3,000	Vine Corps Inc. will use grant funds for direct costs of comprehensive youth development and education programs for teens, including salaries, youth leader stipends, insurance, equipment, materials and supplies, transportation, and other project and outing expenses.
Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc.	\$2,500	Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc. will use grant funds to support educational outreach efforts and rehearsal/concert venue rental fees.

Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$1,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs: providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need that live in the county. Funds will also be used for CCBCM's COVID initiative. More specifically, this initiative provides supplemental assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID to help them with expenses for rent, food, utilities and medicine.
Community Youth Advance, Inc.	\$1,000	Community Youth Advance, Inc. will use grant funds to deliver year-round quality academic enrichment, mentoring, and college and career readiness activities that promote academic excellence, promote character and prepare youth to succeed in college and career.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc.	\$1,000	Jacob's Ladder, Inc. will use grant funds for their on going programs: Diversion, Juvenile Reentry, Junior Workforce Academy, Academic Enrichment, Teenpreneur Challenges and Community Awareness Events.
Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council, Inc.	\$1,000	Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council will use grant funds to offset fund cuts to its signature grant program which supports artists, arts organizations and agencies throughout the County through Artist Fellowships, County Arts (organizations), Arts in Education and Public Art.
