<a href="#">Seventh Councilmanic District Constitute Fund Committee</a>	\$10,000	Seventh Councilmanic District Constitute Fund Committee will use grant funds to assist needy families, including families impacted by COVID-19, with payment of rent and utilities to prevent evictions and turn off of utilities services. Funds will also provide shoes, school uniforms, supplies for needy students and support for Youth Shelter.
<a href="#">The Training Source, Inc.</a>	\$10,000	The Training Source, Inc. will use grant funds for general operating support of adult job training; youth leadership; youth job readiness; college and career planning; community support services (COVID-19 assistance, SNAP application assistance, etc.); employer staffing assistance and training, etc.
<a href="#">Suitland High School</a>	\$10,000	Suitland High School Football Program will use grant funds for mentoring, guidance, life lessons, teaching, tutoring and coaching. More specifically, grant funds will be used to purchase football uniforms and headsets that are antiquated or irreparable. The headsets are needed for communication between coaches and players in games and practice.
<a href="#">Neighborhood Design Center , Inc.</a>	\$8,500	Neighborhood Design Center , Inc. will use grant funds to support staffing which is essential to their core mission services and ensures continuity of pro-bono design during COVID health and economic crisis and recovery.
<a href="#">Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association DFS</a>	\$8,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association DFS will use grants funds to make scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors, continuing college students, and achievement award to middle school students in the local communities of Prince George's County, Maryland.
<a href="#">The Solid Foundation, Inc.</a>	\$7,500	The Solid Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to support returning citizens/justice involved citizens to receive entrepreneurship, financial literacy and management training to support this citizens in establishing their business which will impact District 9. The fund will support start-up costs.
<a href="#">Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.</a>	\$7,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, Public Safety tours, leadership development and life skills, with the goal of higher education or workforce development and an improved quality of life.
<a href="#">The Foundation for the Advancement of Music and Education, Inc. (FAME)</a>	\$5,500	The Foundation for the Advancement of Music and Education, Inc. (FAME) will use grant funds to support its annual Summer Music Program in July and August 2022 for 200 youth at the University of Maryland School and at Dr. Henry Wise High School. More specifically, funds will support music technology / production workshops, instrumental instruction workshops and vocal workshops for middle and high school students.
<a href="#">First Generation College Bound, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	First Generation College Bound will use grant funds for operational expenses. More specifically, funds will be used to support the College Success and Homework Club programs and related expenses.
<a href="#">World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium</a>	\$5,000	World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium will use grant funds to support services and programs at the Creative Suitland Art Center. More specifically, funds will be used to help retain staff and implement its programs in its first fully operational year.
<a href="#">NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
<a href="#">Community Legal Services of Prince George's County, Inc.</a>	\$5,000	Community Legal Services of Prince George's County will use grant funds to provide general legal services to reach out to under-served areas of the County lacking access to legal services, including its Pilot Jail program to assist inmates in the Prince George's County Detention Center and representation for survivors of domestic violence.

<a href="#"><u>Community Crisis Services Inc.</u></a>	\$5,000	Community Crisis Services Inc. will use grant funds to provide one (1) Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) trainings and one (1) Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) trainings to up to twenty five (25) persons each for a total of 50 community members trained in suicide prevention and crisis intervention.
<a href="#"><u>Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland</u></a>	\$3,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland will use grant funds to provide 150-250 COVID-19 affected applicants (mostly mothers and seniors) housing assistance consisting of consultations, referral services and small grants to avoid evictions.
<a href="#"><u>Scenic America</u></a>	\$2,000	Scenic America will use grants funds to conduct Prince George's County community organizing for scenic beauty and economic development issues.
<a href="#"><u>The Denney House, Inc.</u></a>	\$2,000	The Denney House will use grant funds for expenses related to support the transitional housing that it offers through the Prince George's County Community Partnership for Vulnerable and Impacted Populations.
