Project Bright Future Mentoring Inc. (PBFMI)	\$15,000	Project Bright Future Mentoring Inc. will use grants funds to purchase food, supplies and equipment for Food Distribution and services for families in and around the District 8 and Prince George's County communities.
NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$8,000	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$7,500	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, Public Safety tours, leadership development and life skills, with the goal of higher education or workforce development and an improved quality of life.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$6,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$6,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA) will use grant funds to support its CAAPA Arts Academy, a multi-genre year-round arts program for youth Pre-K to 12th Grade which includes Spring Break Camp, Summer Camp and a Saturday program in music, dance, visual arts, theatre and technology.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc.	\$5,000	Jacob's Ladder, Inc. will use grant funds for their on going programs: Diversion, Juvenile Reentry, Junior Workforce Academy, Academic Enrichment, Teenpreneur Challenges and Community Awareness Events.
Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc.	\$5,000	Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care will use grant funds to continue providing wellness, prenatal and behavioral health services to uninsured participants amidst the pandemic at its Adelphi health clinic in Prince George's County.
Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council, Inc.	\$5,000	Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council will use grant funds to offset fund cuts to its signature grant program which supports artists, arts organizations and agencies throughout the County through Artist Fellowships, County Arts (organizations), Arts in Education and Public Art.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$5,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs: providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need that live in the county. Funds will also be used for CCBCM's COVID initiative. More specifically, this initiative provides supplemental assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID to help them with expenses for rent, food, utilities and medicine.
Gateway Second Chance Foundation	\$5,000	Gateway Second Chance Foundation will use grant funds to help meet the costs associated with their A.S.S.I.S.T. Summer Program which supports students throughout the County. The program includes weekly tutoring, a 6 week summer pre-apprentice and mentoring program, and two one-week camping experiences.
Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland	\$5,000	Community Ministry of Prince George's County, Maryland will use grant funds to provide 150-250 COVID-19 affected applicants (mostly mothers and seniors) housing assistance consisting of consultations, referral services and small grants to avoid evictions.
Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Assoc. Dollar for Scholars	\$5,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association Dollar for Scholars will use grant funds to provide scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors, continuing college students, and achievement awards to middle school students in the local communities of Prince George's County, Maryland.
The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships to students who are in or attend a school in Prince George's County as well as, continuing or returning scholarship to an aspiring college student.

<u>Neighborhood Design Center , Inc.</u>	\$5,000	Neighborhood Design Center , Inc. will use grant funds to support staffing which is essential to their core mission services and ensures continuity of pro-bono design during COVID health and economic crisis and recovery.
<u>River Jordan Project, Inc.</u>	\$3,000	River Jordan Project, Inc. will use grant funds for direct cost of food assistance for seniors, individuals and families who are experiencing food insecurity and emergency food for those with chronic diseases, cancer, or other illnesses impacted by COVID-19 Pandemic.
<u>Lindaben Foundation</u>	\$2,500	Lindaben Foundation will use grant funds to supports its wellness feeding program to serve a Title I school in District 8 or local communities that are a "food insecurity hot spot" or "food desert."
<u>Community Forklift</u>	\$2,500	Community Forklift will use grant funds for expenses related to its Home Essentials Program (HELP) which provides free home materials to underserved residents in District 8 of Prince George's County and beyond.
<u>L.E.E.P to College Foundation, Inc.</u>	\$2,500	L.E.E.P to College Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to sustain their L.E.E.P to College Foundation programs. Funds would increase academic support, reduce chronic absenteeism and provide mental health services to Prince George's County youth.
<u>Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc.</u>	\$2,000	Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc. will use grant funds to support their efforts in expanding their programs, provide organizational funding needed due to a lack of fundraising, due to COVID-19. Funds will also help them to establish new partnerships in the County to expand the number of youth they can receive.
