Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$18,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, Public Safety tours, leadership development and life skills, with the goal of higher education or workforce development and an improved quality of life.
Bold Beautiful Brilliant Girls Youth Empowerment Group	\$15,000	Bold Beautiful Brilliant Girls Youth Empowerment Group will use grant funds to provide mentoring for young ladies 8 - 18 to be empowered as servant leaders in their community.
Old School Boxing Athletic Center, Inc.	\$10,000	Old School Boxing Athletic Center will use grant funds for rent, utilities and maintaining equipment.
4Ever Unified, Inc.	\$10,000	4Ever Unified will use grant funds for 30 individuals at the Clinton Manor Senior Living Facility to have a Senior Spa Day and for a series of pop-up events for community youth and their families during June, July and August. Funds will also be used for gift cards, refreshments, etc..
Purposeful Living and Giving Inc	\$7,500	Purposeful Living and Giving Inc (PLG) will use the funds to purchase back packs/school supplies, turkeys, toys and lunches for the ongoing Prince George's County community based programs that Purposeful Living & Giving will continue to perform.
PTA MD Congress of Parents & Teachers, Inc d/b/a Accokeek Academy PTSA	\$7,000	PTA Maryland Congress of Parents & Teachers, Inc d/b/a Accokeek Academy PTSA will use grant funds to purchase hand sanitizers, gloves and additional classroom cleaning supplies, Purchase a new school sign. Purchase traffic signs and provide landscaping beautification for the corner at the front of school.
Police District V Citizens Advisory Council	\$5,500	Police District V Citizens Advisory Council will use grant funds for community outreach and to foster a strong community / police partnership.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$5,000	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.
The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships to students who are in or attend a school in Prince George's County as well as, continuing or returning scholarship to an aspiring college student.
River Jordan Project, Inc.	\$4,500	River Jordan Project, Inc. will use grant funds for direct cost of food assistance for seniors, individuals and families who are experiencing food insecurity and emergency food for those with chronic diseases, cancer, or other illnesses impacted by COVID-19 Pandemic.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$2,500	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs: providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need that live in the county. Funds will also be used for CCBCM's COVID initiative. More specifically, this initiative provides supplemental assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID to help them with expenses for rent, food, utilities and medicine.
Arc of Prince George's County	\$2,000	Arc of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support their programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and their Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc.	\$2,000	Jacob's Ladder, Inc. will use grant funds for their on going programs: Diversion, Juvenile Reentry, Junior Workforce Academy, Academic Enrichment, Teenpreneur Challenges and Community Awareness Events.
Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA)	\$2,000	Coalition for African Americans in the Performing Arts (CAAPA) will use grant funds to support its CAAPA Arts Academy, a multi-genre year-round arts program for youth Pre-K to 12th Grade which includes Spring Break Camp, Summer Camp and a Saturday program in music, dance, visual arts, theatre and technology.
NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$2,000	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc.	\$1,000	Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc. will use grant funds to support their efforts in expanding their programs, provide organizational funding needed due to a lack of fundraising, due to COVID-19. Funds will also help them to establish new partnerships in the County to expand the number of youth they can receive.
