Southern Prince George's County Community Charities, Inc. (SPGCCCI)	\$10,000	Southern Prince George's County Community Charities (SPGCCCI) will use grant funds for scholarships for underserved students in Prince George's County to help allow them to further their education.
Old School Boxing Athletic Center, Inc.	\$10,000	Old School Boxing Athletic Center will use grant funds for rent, utilities and maintaining equipment.
M V P Incorporated	\$10,000	M V P Incorporated (Men of Valor and Purpose) will use grant funds to support Sport STEM Camp 2022 to benefit students in the Coral Hills and Landover areas. More specifically, the camp offers participants structured physical activities incorporated with STEM to improve their overall academic performance based on the physical and academic activities they took part in.
Charles Herbert Flowers High School	\$10,000	Charles Herbert Flowers High School will use grant funds for their Football Program Uniforms, general football equipment, communication equipment and portable water coolers.
Women Empowered To Achieve The impossible, Inc. (WETATi)	\$5,000	WETATi will use grant funds to benefit low- and moderate-income youth in the underserved communities of Prince George's County, along with Maryland state colleges and universities. More specifically, funds will be used to transition WETATi's programs and business offerings online, to upgrade the website, to hire full-time and part-time staff, and to develop and expand its programs systematically.
Jacob's Ladder, Inc.	\$5,000	Jacob's Ladder, Inc. will use grant funds for their on going programs: Diversion, Juvenile Reentry, Junior Workforce Academy, Academic Enrichment, Teenpreneur Challenges and Community Awareness Events.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to continue their ETHM's Pathway to Career Success program, which develops youth academically with a career and college preparation focus, including on-time graduation and preparation for college and workforce entry.
Derek Anthony Moore Charity, Inc. (DAMCI)	\$5,000	Derek Anthony Moore Charity, Inc. will use grant funds to expand their COVID 19 Safety Net, which includes providing emergency food distribution, housing and utility assistance. Also, the continuation of their various programs: Kids to Kamp sponsorships, Conflict Resolution Workshops, and Mothers Against Murder Support Group & Workshop.
Bursting With Promise, Inc.	\$5,000	Bursting With Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships for qualified and deserving Maryland students entering Morgan State University; laptops for high school students; backpack/school supplies for elementary school students; book stipends and graduation awards for previous scholarship recipients.
The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$5,000	The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships to students who are in or attend a school in Prince George's County as well as, continuing or returning scholarship to an aspiring college student.
Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church	\$4,500	Beltsville Seventh Day Adventist Church will use grant funds to purchase and distribute 550 Thanksgiving turkey baskets to District 1 families.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$4,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs: providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need that live in the county. Funds will also be used for CCBCM's COVID initiative. More specifically, this initiative provides supplemental assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID to help them with expenses for rent, food, utilities and medicine.

Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association DFS	\$4,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association DFS will use grants funds to make scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors, continuing college students, and achievement award to middle school students in the local communities of Prince George's County, Maryland.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$3,500	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
Vine Corps Inc.	\$3,000	Vine Corps Inc. will use gran funds for direct costs of comprehensive youth development and education programs for teens, including salaries, youth leader stipends, insurance, equipment, materials and supplies, transportation, and other project and outing expenses.
Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area, Inc.	\$3,000	Meals on Wheels of the College Park Area will use grant funds to purchase food items to assist in the preparation of meals for its clients. The more than tripling of its client base, along with the need to relocate, has stretched the organization's budget. Funds will help to maintain the price of the daily client fee.
Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc.	\$2,500	Prince George's Philharmonic, Inc. will use grant funds to support educational outreach efforts and rehearsal/concert venue rental fees.
SEAC, Inc.	\$2,500	SEAC will use grant funds to support stipends to college students working in its #MAP (Math Achievers' Program), a six-week free summer math instruction and enhancement program for Prince George's County middle school students and their parents.
Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc.	\$1,500	Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare, Inc. will use grant funds to support their Community Cat Initiative which, through "trap/neuter/return" (TNR), is reducing the feral cat population in Bowie and County Districts 3,4,5 and 6.
ecoLatinos, Inc.	\$1,500	ecoLatinos will use grant funds for supporting volunteer outreach at Prince George's County waterways - tent, tables, flyers, water - to educate the public on water quality. Funds will also used to help pay the project coordinator, the social media campaign designer for 10 weeks of social media outreach and to purchase plants as gifts for the volunteers.
