WealthyGen, Inc.	\$35,000	WealthyGen, Inc. will use grant funds for their 2021 Thanksgiving Turkey Drive, feeding up to 260 families in PG County with turkeys for Thanksgiving.
NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc.	\$7,500	NAMI Prince George's County, MD, Inc. will use grant funds to provide mental health education, support, advocacy, and community outreach programs for County residents.
Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc.	\$5,000	Prince Georges County Police Athletic League, Inc. will use grant funds to support their efforts in expanding their programs, provide organizational funding needed due to a lack of fundraising, due to COVID-19. Funds will also help them to establish new partnerships in the County to expand the number of youth they can receive.
End Time Harvest Ministries, Inc.	\$5,000	End Time Harvest Ministries will use grant funds to continue their ETHM's Pathway to Career Success program, which develops youth academically with a career and college preparation focus, including on-time graduation and preparation for college and workforce entry.
Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc.	\$5,000	Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. will use grant funds to offer services to youth, including driver education scholarships, Public Safety tours, leadership development and life skills, with the goal of higher education or workforce development and an improved quality of life.
Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council, Inc.	\$4,000	Prince George's Arts and Humanities Council will use grant funds to offset fund cuts to its signature grant program which supports artists, arts organizations and agencies throughout the County through Artist Fellowships, County Arts (organizations), Arts in Education and Public Art.
Juanita C. Grant Foundation, Inc.	\$4,000	Juanita C. Grant Foundation, Inc. will use grant funds to support development and implement a comprehensive Resource Center on Aging providing County-wide consultation, education, and research on older adult issues. These services would be accessed through Council Member's At-Large Office.
Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Assoc. Dollars for Scholars	\$4,000	Hillcrest-Marlow Heights Civic Association Dollars for Scholars will use grants to make scholarship awards to deserving high school seniors, continuing college students, and achievement awards to middle school students in the local communities of Prince George's County, Maryland.
The Denney House, Inc.	\$4,000	The Denney House will use grant funds for expenses related to support the transitional housing that it offers through the Prince George's County Community Partnership for Vulnerable and Impacted Populations.
4Ever Unified, Inc.	\$4,000	4Ever Unified will use grant funds for 30 individuals at the Clinton Manor Senior Living Facility to have a Senior Spa Day and for a series of pop-up events for community youth and their families during June, July and August. Funds will also be used for gift cards, refreshments, etc..
The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc.	\$3,500	The Ivy Community Charities of Prince George's County, Inc. will use grant funds to provide scholarships to students who are in or attend a school in Prince George's County as well as, continuing or returning scholarship to an aspiring college student.
Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM)	\$3,000	Coalition of Concerned Black Christian Men (CCBCM) will use grant funds to support its two major programs: providing annual scholarships to Prince George's County high school seniors and providing food and monetary donations to families in need that live in the county. Funds will also be used for CCBCM's COVID initiative. More specifically, this initiative provides supplemental assistance to Prince George's County residents impacted by COVID to help them with expenses for rent, food, utilities and medicine.
Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc.	\$3,000	Hope Connections for Cancer Support, Inc will use grant funds to help people with cancer and their loved ones deal with the social, emotional, and physical impact of cancer through professionally facilitated programs of emotional support, education, wellness, and hope.
Food & Friends, Inc.	\$2,500	Food & Friends will use grant funds to provide home-delivered, medically-tailored meals and groceries to people living with serious illnesses like HIV, cancer, diabetes, COPD, end-stage renal disease, etc., whose illness prevents them from shopping for and preparing food for themselves.

Neighborhood Design Center, Inc.	\$2,500	Neighborhood Design Center, Inc. will use grant funds to support staffing which is essential to their core mission services and ensures continuity of pro-bono design during COVID health and economic crisis and recovery.
Community Crisis Services Inc.	\$2,500	Community Crisis Services Inc. will use grant funds to provide one (1) Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) trainings and one (1) Assessing Suicide in Kids (ASK) trainings to up to twenty five (25) persons each for a total of 50 community members trained in suicide prevention and crisis intervention.
World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium	\$2,000	World Arts Focus, Inc., dba Joe's Movement Emporium will use grant funds to support services and programs at the Creative Suitland Art Center. More specifically, funds will be used to help retain staff and implement its programs in its first fully operational year.
Liberty's Promise, Inc.	\$2,000	Liberty's Promise, Inc. will use grant funds to support an after-school program of civic engagement, held at four Prince George's County High Schools, twice annually, either in-person or virtually, in 10-week sessions, running from March to May and again from October to December.
Arc of Prince George's County	\$1,500	Arc of Prince George's County will use grant funds to support their programming that assists youth with I/DD successfully transition from school to adulthood, and their Benefits Enrollment Center, which connects individuals to public benefits to which they are entitled.
