<p>UM Capital Region Health Funding will support the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Center of The University of Maryland Capital Region Health <i>DV/SAC Prevention and Training Program</i>, which provides technical assistance, professional training, and prevention education in three main focus areas. These include: law enforcement personnel; college/university faculty, staff, and students; and participants in the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development New Future Bridge Subsidy Housing Program. <p>Community Crisis Services, Inc. Community Crisis Services, Inc. (CCSI) Funding to support Safe Passages Shelter. The Safe Passages Shelter is the only domestic violence shelter in Prince George’s County and provides emergency housing and limited rental assistance for individuals and families escaping domestic violence. CCSI has been serving individuals and families in crisis in the County 24/7, 365 days a year since 1970. While at the shelter, all guests have access to basic needs and ongoing support services including meals, counseling, educational support for school-aged children, daycare, transportation, etc. Additionally, case managers and after-care specialists work with the individuals to plan the next steps following their exit from the shelter, in an attempt to ensure a pathway to success. This includes assisting guests with budgetary planning and applications for social services. In FY 22, the telephone and shelter staff provided support to 3,558 callers, responded to 131 domestic violence ‘chats’, and provided 14,332 nights of shelter to 449 survivors of domestic violence within the County. <p>St. Matthews Housing Corporation St. Matthew’s Housing Corporation (SMHC) – Funding provides transitional housing for families who are survivors of domestic violence. The Housing project will provide stable, ongoing, and secure housing for at least 5-8 survivors of domestic violence households at its Beta House location in Bowie. In addition to housing, services will be provided for financial counseling, mental health, and domestic violence counseling. SMHC works with CCSI case managers to identify and screen potential candidates for placement. In addition, SMHC works in collaboration with the Prince George’s County Department of Social Services Housing Prioritization Panel. SMHC employs a social navigator for access to the growing network of county social services to provide for a continuity of care program.</p>	\$40,000



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT	
<p>Prince George’s Community College (PGCC) Purple Skies at PGCC is a scholarship program for survivors and their children. The program will provide scholarships for accelerated continuing education courses that culminate with digital badges and/or industry certifications. The college offers participants an opportunity to register for a course or a mini pathway. Mini pathways are typically comprised of a cluster of at least 3 courses that provide stackable credentials, such as Certified Nursing Assistants (CAN), Helpdesk Technician, or Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) technicians. COUNSELING/MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES	
<p>One Love Life Center OLLC will provide a comprehensive evidenced-based program for twelve (12) IPV offenders in PG County. Services will be provided at OLLC’s home office in Temple Hills, MD. Transportation will be provided for those needing access and support. The program model is an 18-wk program with an intensive 14 weeks where participants receive two (2) 90-mins. therapy session each week. The final 4-wks will consist of one (1) 90-mins. session per week. Our program model does allow for limited voluntary victim participation in their offender’s treatment. <p>Greater Baden Medical Services Funding will support the “Greater Baden Integrated Behavioral Health and Counseling Program (IBHCP). The IBHCP proposes to make 240 sessions of behavioral health counseling available to domestic violence litigants over the one-year project period. Grant funding for the DVGP will provide partial salary support for the multi-disciplinary Greater Baden IBHCP provider team, consisting of (1) a Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner, (2) a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, and (3) a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor. <p>Mary's Center Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care, Inc. Mary's Center specifically requests a grant in the amount of \$50,000 to be used over a one-year period (January 2023 – January 2024). The funds will be used to support the salary and expenses for a full-time Family Support Worker (FSW) at our Adelphi clinic in Prince George's County, who will help domestic violence survivors and their children to obtain domestic violence counseling and therapy to move past their traumatic experiences and heal. <p>ADVOCACY/LEGAL</p>	
<p>Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc. (CAFY) Community Advocates for Family & Youth, Inc (CAFY). Funding will support CAFY's Advocacy and Reducing Self Representation project, which will assist clients in navigating through multiple legal systems, i.e. criminal, civil, and administrative justice systems. In order to maximize the impact of the grant, CAFY proposes, a) case management, b) legal support activities, c) partnering with Community Legal Services (CLS), Ayuda, A Father's Place, and the Anchor Fund. By collaborating with CLS on this program, CAFY is able to expand its capacity to help more victims and expand legal services offerings beyond protective orders. <p>La Clinica de Pueblo Funding will support La Clinica's proposed project, <i>Advocating for Latina Survivors of Domestic Violence in Prince George's County</i>, which would provide survivors of domestic violence with comprehensive, peer-led advocacy and navigation services. The critical support of Prince George's County Council through the Domestic Violence Grant Program would enable the <i>Entre Amigas</i> team to screen, advocate for, and navigate 30 Latina survivors of domestic violence to legal and supportive services. La Clinica will partner with CARECEN, CASA, and CAFY to deliver culturally and linguistically appropriate services to low-income Latina immigrants in our region. Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA)

With this funding support, CASA will ensure 100% of Domestic Violence-exposed children who are referred to CASA and living in Prince George's County are matched with a trained CASA Advocate who will advocate for them. The Advocacy for Child Victims and Witnesses of Domestic Violence project will provide a comprehensive program of serving and coordination of providers for children exposed to family violence and domestic violence; provide non-professional legal services and advocacy case management. CASA will collaborate with DSS, the Juvenile Court, Family Justice Center, and the UMD Do Good Institute and address the needs of youth who have been exposed to family violence, domestic violence, or dating violence; improve the Court's handling of child maltreatment cases, and break the cycle of abuse that brought them into foster care.
